RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Promoting holistic development of rural communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

Over 50% of Bihar's population is multidimensionally poor. Agriculture, once its economic bedrock, suffers due to reasons ranging from flooding to inadequate farming methods. This results in mass migrations, which bring with it its own set of problems such as exploitation, food insecurity & health degradation.

HDFC Bank's Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP) is working towards improving livelihoods in these villages through:

- Advanced farming practices
- ✓ Solar power-based group irrigation to promote multi-cropping
- ✓ Ensuring access to clean drinking water & sanitation
- ✓ Promotion of green energy



IMPACT IN BIHAR













BIO RESOURCE CENTER: CATALYSING REGENERATIVE AGRICULTURE | DISTRICTS -BANKA, KISHANGANJ

The Bio Resource Center (BRC) by HDFC Bank Parivartan is empowering rural women entrepreneurs who are trained to produce vital bio inputs, enhancing regenerative farming practices and reducing chemical usage. These bio inputs, including Super compost, Jeevamrit, Bijamrit, Agneyastra, Neemastra, Mathastra, and Humic acid, are employed by 300 farmers in producer groups cultivating cash crops. The strategic use of 3 metric tons of super compost has resulted in increased production and improved output quality, leading to better selling prices for the farmers. The Bio Resource Center is driving positive change towards regenerative agriculture.

ENHANCING INCOME THROUGH POLYHOUSE STRUCTURE | DISTRICTS - BANKA, JAMUI, SAMASTIPUR AND KISHANGANJ

In collaboration with PRADAN, HDFC Bank Parivartan is working to uplift the income of 31 women farmers across Banka, Jamui, Samastipur, and Kishanganj districts through polyhouse structures. These structures enable women farmers to cultivate high-value cash crops like seedless cucumber, capsicum, French beans, brinjal, and more. The women undergo comprehensive training in transplantation, paste management, and cash crop farming. The strategic selection of crops based on weather conditions and market demand allows them to supply produce early, fetching higher prices. With earnings ranging from 35,000 to 40,000 rupees per farmer in a single season, this initiative not only boosts their income but also establishes a sustainable agricultural model in these districts.

CATTLE FEED ENTERPRISE FOR RURAL PROSPERITY | DISTRICT - BEGUSARAI

With support by HDFC Bank Parivartan, NIRDESH collaborated with "Sadhna Swayam Sahayita" Sumuh," comprising 11 women in Chakka Village, under the Holistic Rural Development Programme. They've established a Community Enterprise for Cattle Feed Production (Bhagirath Pashu Aahar Utpadan Kendra) to boost the income of women farmers. The initiative aims to produce and sell cattle feed locally and externally. Chakka Village, primarily dependent on cultivation and animal rearing, faces challenges in accessing quality fodder. The Community Enterprise addresses this need, encouraging micro-enterprises to benefit farmers in 15 surrounding villages. The enterprise initially targets Chokar, Plete, and Flour/Maida production, with an initial monthly earning of Rs.7000 per member, expected to increase to Rs.10,000-15,000.









REVITALISING RURAL LIVELIHOODS | DISTRICTS - BHAGALPUR, BAHRAICH, ALMORA

To address the decline in agricultural productivity and economic challenges in Bhagalpur, Bahraich, and Almora, SUVIDHA, in collaboration with HDFC Bank Parivartan, is implementing a project to revitalise rural livelihoods. Key components include:

- ✓ Increasing income through sustainable, chemical-free farming practices and community-led enterprises.
- Promoting community enterprises such as organic basmati rice production and Bhagalpur silk handloom units.
- ✓ Forming and empowering Village Development Committees (VDCs), Producer Groups, and Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs).
- ✓ Providing agricultural inputs and promoting practices like organic methods and integrated pest management.
- Strengthening water storage and rainwater harvesting systems, developing micro-irrigation facilities, and promoting solar energy solutions.
- Expanding agricultural mechanisation with farm tool banks, including power tillers, weeders, and threshers.
- Enhancing productivity through techniques like mulching and chain fencing.

This initiative aims to uplift rural populations, stimulate local economies, and ensure sustainable development through a comprehensive approach to agricultural and community development.









NURTURING RURAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP | DISTRICTS - ARARIA, KATIHAR

To address the socio-economic challenges in Araria and Katihar, Professional Assistance for Development Action, in collaboration with HDFC Bank Parivartan, is implementing a project aimed at nurturing rural entrepreneurship and enhancing economic opportunities. Key components include:

- ✓ Supporting over 20,000 women and youth through training programs to start and manage businesses in both farm and non-farm sectors.
- ✓ Improving agricultural practices by introducing new technologies and techniques, including solar-powered irrigation systems and bio-resource centers.
- → Forming community institutions, such as Village Development. Committees and Farmer Producer Organizations, to provide ongoing support and guidance.
- Expanding land under cultivation by installing solar-based lift irrigation systems.
- ✓ Facilitating connections between farmers and buyers to improve market access and profitability.

This initiative seeks to uplift rural communities by fostering entrepreneurship, enhancing agricultural productivity, and providing critical support through community institutions and technology.







PROMOTION OF EDUCATION

Creating a conducive learning environment in communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

CREATING S.A.F.E. COMMUNITIES

Rural Bihar faces numerous challenges in the education sector resulting in low-attendance levels & even school drop-outs. Additionally, rampant social evils have long hampered the upbringing of many children.

Aiming at overhauling the root causes, the **S.A.F.E. project** - a comprehensive initiative from Parivartan - aims at providing:

- ✓ Safety & protection to children
- Easy access to government schemes
- → Family & community support
- → Education & employment

In addition to the above:

- ✓ Women are empowered to deal with these issues
- ✓ Special safety networks are created to identify cases of child exploitation & harm
- Awareness sessions are organised for families regarding safety precautions for their children
- ✓ Families are linked to government schemes, enabling them to provide education to their children

All of these components of the programme have cumulatively led to safer schools & further willingness of parents to ensure education for their children, thus eliminating other social evils.













ZERO-INVESTMENT INNOVATIONS FOR EDUCATION INITIATIVES (ZIIEI)

One of the largest ever programmes of its kind to facilitate wide-scale implementation of low-cost innovations, the ZIIEI project in Bihar has oriented 65 education officers while 40,280 schools have implemented its ideas thus far.

DIGITISING EDUCATION IN BIHAR | DISTRICTS - AURANGABAD, NAWADA

With the aim of making technology available to all, Parivatan has installed smart classrooms in government schools across 4 districts in Bihar. Digital infrastructure like projectors preloaded with curriculum based content & interactive boards have not just made learning fun but classrooms are now vibrant & student friendly. This intervention has directly impacted over 12,000 students. Teachers too have been trained to make effective use of these advancements.

As a result of these classrooms, students have been instilled with new-found confidence & exhibit higher engagement levels.

OPTIMISING LEARNING

Quality education during the pandemic became a distant dream for many. Various issues such as lack of guidance under renowned institutions, cropped up. Parivartan, along with Khan Academy, announced a four year alliance to distribute high-quality learning resources to equip students with better foundational understanding of mathematics and improve their learning outcomes. The courses were free of cost in English, Hinglish, Hindi, Kannada, Punjabi and Gujarati, aligned to the Indian curriculum. Through online education students had access to high-quality learning materials in their language for free. Moreover, it empowered teachers to improve children's learning outcomes, which benefited 150,000 students in grades 6-12, spanning over 1500 schools and 3000+ teachers in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas and government-funded schools over a period of 3-4 years, across India.







SKILL TRAINING AND LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT

Upskilling individuals to enable sustainable income generation

KEY INTERVENTIONS

UPSKILLING WOMEN THROUGH THE SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD INITIATIVE

Our Sustainable Livelihood Initiative (SLI) focusses on empowering women at the bottom of the pyramid by providing them sustainable means of generating income for their families. This has been done by imparting necessary skill training to thousands of women across Bihar.









PROVIDING SKILL-TRAINING TO RURAL YOUTH

Parivartan with Head Held High aims to build skills and capabilities of about 1500 disconnected rural youths across 10 districts of 10 states (Karnataka, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Telangana, Gujarat, Haryana, Odisha). The project also assures placement of at least 70% of the trained youth in a job within a period of 39 months. These locations have been selected due to the high concentration of underprivileged youth in these regions. The project is a part of core program of HHH called Make India Capable (MIC).

EMPOWERING WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS WITH A STITCHING HUB | DISTRICT - KISHANGANJ

HDFC Bank Parivartan and PRADAN have established a Stitching Hub in Chapati village, ThakurGanj Block, Kishanganj District. Ten women entrepreneurs, previously engaged in household chores, now realise their dream with HDFC Bank's support. They received training in sewing practices, achievement motivation, and business management. These entrepreneurs, stitching clothes for local communities, have not only gained sustainable income but have also earned recognition as women entrepreneurs. Their average monthly earnings of 4000-5000 per member have significantly boosted their confidence, garnering respect within their families and society. This initiative has not only transformed their lives but has also reinforced the vital role women play in entrepreneurship and community development.







HEALTHCARE AND HYGIENE

Focussed on improving sanitation facilities & promoting good & safe hygiene practices

KEY INTERVENTIONS

BETTERING MEDICAL INFRASTRUCTURE AT PATNA MEDICAL COLLEGE HOSPITAL **DISTRICT - PATNA**

To improve the medical infrastructure at Patna Medical College and Hospital (PMCH), which is visited by numerous patients from the outskirts of the city during emergencies, HDFC Bank Parivartan in association with Care India Solutions for Sustainable Development is in the process of setting up a Cath lab by partnering with the cardiology department of the hospital. The latter is essential for conducting tests and procedures including ablation, angiogram, angioplasty and more and will go a long way in supporting patients with critical heart ailments. The project will prove to be quite beneficial for those from socio-economically marginal backgrounds who may not be able to afford quality care otherwise.

INITIATIVE FOR MILLET REVITALISATION BY WOMEN

LOCATION: KUSHMAHA VILLAGE, CHAKAI BLOCK, JAMUI DISTRICT

BENEFICIARIES: 8 WOMEN FARMERS

THE CHALLENGE

Millet cultivation in Chakai has traditionally been limited, primarily used as fodder for animals or exchanged for rice. Unfortunately, the inclusion of millets in their own dietary habits was lacking, exacerbated by the younger generation's aversion due to its colour and taste.

OUR INTERVENTION

Under HDFC Bank Parivartan, we established an Agricultural Produce Processing Centre. This centre, managed by a group of 8 women entrepreneurs, focuses on producing various millet-based products, including peanut cookies, coconut cookies, jeera & ajwain cookies, and millet laddu. Additionally, these products are not only available in local markets but have also reached distant markets.

THE RESULT

Today, the women entrepreneurs successfully operate the processing centre, earning recognition and respect in society. Their efforts have not only revitalised millet consumption in the region but have also empowered these women to establish themselves as valuable contributors to their community.



STORIES OF PARIVARTAN



TRANSFORMING AGRICULTURE THROUGH BIO-FLOC FISH FARMING

LOCATION: KUSOKHAR VILLAGE, CHAKANDRA PANCHAYAT, SHEIKHPURA DISTRICT BENEFICIARIES: 10 FARMERS FROM SHIVSHANKAR KISAN SAMUH

THE CHALLENGE

Insufficient rainfall in Kusokhar village led to severe agricultural challenges, impacting productivity. Farmers struggled financially, resorting to seeking work outside the village.

OUR INTERVENTION

IDF, in collaboration with HDFC Bank Parivartan, initiated a farmer group to address challenges collectively. Ten farmers from Shivshankar Kisan Samuh embraced bio-floc fish farming, a sustainable solution optimising space and minimising resource usage.

THE RESULT

After one cycle, the group earned a substantial revenue of 110,000 rupees by selling fish. Inspired, they plan to start the next cycle in January, offering renewed hope and sustainable income to the village, showcasing the power of collective action in transforming livelihoods.



PARIVARTAN HIGHLIGHTS



HEALTH & NUTRITION AWARENESS GENERATION CAMPAIGN

In an awareness program across 15 villages in Bachwara block, 441 participants, including adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating mothers, were educated on children's health and nutrition. Separate refresher training was held for 352 adolescent girls, covering topics like nutrition from local produce, weight and height measurement, folic acid intake, and reproductive health. Practical demonstrations, including a painting competition, highlighted the importance of nutrition. The training also emphasised spreading awareness in schools and villages. AWWs and ANMs conducted counselling on topics like good touch, bad touch, and sanitation.

AGRICULTURAL TOOL BANKS **ESTABLISHED**

On June 27, 2023, agricultural tool banks were established in six villages across Pakri Barawan and Warisaliganj Blocks to empower small and marginal farmers. These banks provide affordable access to machinery like CD pumps, paddy cutters, and sprayers. Managed by village organisations, they support HRDP's mission to enhance farmers' income, participation, and control over their livelihoods. The tool banks also foster knowledge sharing and capacity building among farmers, aiming to boost productivity and economic conditions.



FARMING EQUIPMENT PROVIDED TO **WOMEN FARMERS IN BIHAR**

HDFC Bank Parivartan and Sarva Seva Samity Sanstha provided self-propelled reaper machines to Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) in Gaya, Bihar. These machines will help the women farmers become self-reliant, reduce their efforts during the tiresome harvest season, and help the FPOs generate a source of revenue by renting the reaper machines to the farmers.

It identifies & addresses the critical needs of each village through interventions designed carefully after consulting village communities & other stakeholders.

ZIIEI, one of our largest programmes is in its third phase, focusing improving learning outcomes in more than 10,000 schools across India integrating the concepts of 'Project Based Learning'. Taking cue from the National Education Policy 2020, the project, has embarked on a journey to equip teachers with knowledge, attitudes, behaviours and skills they require to meet the learning needs of 21st century learners. The project:



We are committed to comprehensively and sustainably design our programmes in a way where we are able to realise our shared goal of a better and peaceful world in 2030.

PARIVARTAN AND THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Rural Development

Under Parivartan, the bank has been working in 17+ states in India to bring in holistic development in the rural landscape. It has launched the Holistic Rural Development Programme to address key challenges in rural areas.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

- 1. Promoting sustainable agriculture through better water management systems by construction of check dams, farm ponds, community ponds and irrigation systems.
- 2. Empowering farmers through capacity building. Creating Seed Bank, Grain Bank, Village Nursery and supporting field research to achieve food security.

SDG 6 ~ Clean Water and Sanitation

1. Ensuring availability of clean drinking water and promoting sustainable management of water through construction of Rainwater Harvesting Structures, Community Tanks, Hand Pumps and Wells.

SDG7 ~ Affordable and Clean Energy

1. Adopting renewable energy to provide affordable, reliable, sustainable and accessible modern energy through installation of Solar street lights, Biomass Stoves, Community Biogas Plants and Distribution of Solar Home Lights.

Skill Development and Livelihood Enhancement

Administering and enhancing skills is an essential component in increasing employment, ensuring fair share of work and creating sustainable livelihood opportunities. In addition, the bank also focusses on developing livelihood opportunities for women.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

- 1. HDFC Bank Parivartan has created non-farm based employee opportunities to double farmers' incomes. Using productive resources, farmers are trained on livestock management, thus, benefitting indigenous people, women and villagers.
- 2. The bank introduced kitchen gardens in villages in several states to promote sustainable agriculture and ensured improved nutrition to the families while successfully ending hunger. It has facilitated creation of over 40,000 kitchen gardens.

SDG4 ~ Quality Education

1. Under Parivartan, the bank is working to provide access to affordable, technical and vocational education. The bank has trained over 1.60 lakh individuals under its Skill Development programme keeping with principles of equity and inclusivity.

SDG5 ~ Gender Equality

1. Parivartan has formed/revived over 7,500 SHGs with an aim to empower women in rural India. The initiative has strengthened the cause of achieving gender equality by enabling the women to achieve better livelihood opportunities.

SDG8 ~ Decent Work and Economic Growth

- 1. The bank has trained over 1.04 lakh farmers through exposure visits and diverse agricultural training programmes for their sustained economic growth. Through varied capacity building initiatives, the farmers are able to seek full and productive employment.
- 2. Parivartan has empowered farmers through entrepreneurial programmes through financial as well as skill-based support. The bank has facilitated development of dairy cooperatives, poultry farms, integrated poultry-goat rearing-fishery units and other small business to ensure sustained and inclusive growth of the people as well as the region.





















SDG12 ~ Responsible Consumption and Production

1. Through natural farming, formation of seed banks and FPOs, Parivartan has been able to help farmers in innovating their logistics and supply chain, thus enabling sustainable consumption and production patterns.

Promotion of Education

This is one of the most important pillars of Parivartan that promotes equal education to all from early childhood to secondary education. The initiative also advocates usage of technology through digitisation of schools and introducing science labs to encourage the scientific temper of children.

SDG 4 ~ Quality Education

1. To further improve the access to inclusive and equitable quality education, the bank has undertaken several initiatives including remedial classes, learning camps, training the teachers and by offering scholarships. The bank has also created requisite infrastructure for students from underprivileged background to access education in a safe and lively environment.

SDG3 ~ Good Health and Well-Being for People

1. Parivartan has included sports as one of the fundamentals of education to ensure healthy lives of children while promoting their well-being. The bank has facilitated training of hockey, football and other sports while also ensuring access to the requisite sports equipment.

Healthcare and Hygiene

Our bank has actively worked towards providing better healthcare and sanitation facilities to the vulnerable communities. With its special focus in eradicating Non Communicable Diseases in certain states to building accessible sanitation facilities despite challenging terrains, the bank has set an example in the space.

- 1. Under Parivartan, the bank has helped villagers create Kitchen Gardens to improve access to nutritious food and ensure healthy lives.
- 2. By organising health camps and health infrastructures the bank has adopted precautionary approach while helping vulnerable communities prevent themselves from communicable and non-communicable diseases. The bank has also set a Guinness World Record in organising largest blood donation drive.

SDG6 ~ Clean Water and Sanitation

1. With creation of over 28,800 sanitation units across India, the bank has been steadfast in giving access to clean sanitation facilities for all despite terrain related changes. By making adequate and equitable sanitation accessible, the bank has helped end Open Defecation and offered women their dignified access to sanitation.

SDG13 ~ Climate Action

1. The bank has initiated a mass plantation drive and by far planted over 10 lakh trees as one of its urgent actions to combat climate change. The drive has also contributed in increasing the ground water levels and improved agriculture.
