KEY INTERVENTIONS

HOLISTIC RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Agriculture in the hot & semi-arid Gujarat is largely dependent on erratic monsoon and to top it all only 35% of its cultivated area is under irrigation. Hence, HDFC Bank Parivartan - under its Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP) - mainly works towards improving:

- Agricultural practices
- Horticulture
- Orchard farming
- Soil & water conservation measures
- Natural resource management
- Organic farming
- Ravine reclamation



DRIVING SUSTAINABLE GROWTH

DISTRICT - ARAVALLI

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with Navinchandra Mafatlal Sadguru Water & Development Foundation, is transforming agricultural livelihoods for 2,300 women farmers. By enhancing irrigation, promoting sustainable practices, and integrating clean energy, the initiative boosts farm incomes and builds climate resilience. It includes:

- 902 acres brought under improved irrigation through water harvesting and solar-based lift systems
- 412 micro-irrigation units installed, increasing cropping intensity
- 250 households adopting clean energy solutions
- 4,599 farmers trained in diverse agricultural techniques
- 4 women entrepreneurs nurtured through nursery initiatives
- 10 water user groups ensuring sustainable water management

PROTECTING AGRICULTURE THROUGH MILLET FARMING | DISTRICT - KHEDA

The banks of the Mahi river have long been suffering from soil erosion & degradation arising from the formation of deep ravines. The spread of the latter, in addition to moderate levels of local rainfall & lack of available fodder for animal husbandry, has seriously jeopardised the livelihoods of farmers in the region who largely depend on cash-crop cultivation. Over 27,000 hectares of common land - which encompasses the livelihoods of over 74,000 households in the region - has been affected as a result of its spread. The issue was hence taken up by HDFC Bank Parivartan in collaboration with Foundation for Ecological Security (FES) & the committees of 15 villages, who eventually decided upon procuring high quality millet seeds as the solution to the issue. After raising Rs.8 lakh from 1,093 farmers in order to buy them, these seeds are now helping the beneficiaries of the initiative to increase their productivity sufficiently, thus raising the overall standard of living along the Mahi's banks.

ENABLING CHANGE IN SANTALPUR REGION

DISTRICT - PATAN

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with the Aga Khan Rural Support Programme (India) - AKRSP(I), is driving holistic development in Santalpur block. Addressing challenges like water scarcity, low literacy, and seasonal migration, the initiative focuses on agriculture, education, and women's empowerment to uplift livelihoods.

Key interventions include:

- Farm bunding, check dam renovation, and solar irrigation for sustainable water management
- Promotion of natural farming, horticulture, and micro-irrigation
- Upgrading school sanitation, drinking water facilities, introducing smart classrooms
- Nutrition gardens and health training for better community well-being
- Ensuring 20% female participation and fostering women-led enterprises
- Village Development Committees for long-term sustainability

TRANSFORMING LIVELIHOODS WITH INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

| DISTRICT - KUTCH

To address the challenges faced by 17 border villages, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Cohesion Foundation Trust, are implementing a comprehensive development project. This initiative focuses on improving water management and promoting holistic rural development. Key components include:



- Supporting agricultural productivity with optimised irrigation from the Narmada canal, enabling two crop seasons annually
- Upgrading education facilities through school refurbishments and capacity-building workshops for Village Development Committees (VDCs)
- Improving healthcare by supplying equipment to Primary Health Centers (PHCs) and conducting health camps in collaboration with local communities
- Empowering women through skill training and micro-enterprise development
- Installing solar street lights to enhance community infrastructure and sustainability
- Developing Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) materials for awareness and organising exposure visits for VDC members

EMPOWERING VILLAGES, ONE RENOVATION AT A TIME DISTRICT - BANASKANTHA

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with the Aga Khan Rural Support Programme (India) - AKRSP(I), is transforming lives in Suigam and Vav blocks. Facing harsh drought conditions and water scarcity, these communities struggle with agriculture, education, and livelihoods. This initiative introduces sustainable solutions to improve living standards and build resilience.

Key interventions include:

- Farm bunding, check dam renovation, and solar irrigation for water security
- Promotion of natural farming, demonstration farms, and micro-irrigation
- Upgraded school sanitation, drinking water facilities, and nutrition gardens
- Smart classrooms, school, and anganwadi renovations
- Enterprise support and local business development
- Training in farming, hygiene, and governance
- 20% female participation and women-led enterprises
- Forming village Development Committees for local implementation and sustainability

RENOVATION OF SCHOOLS

DISTRICT - BANASKANTHA

HDFC Bank Parivartan in partnership with Collectives for Intergrated Livelihood Initiatives (CInI) revitalised essential school facilities, ensuring better hygiene and access to books for students. By repairing a broken hand wash unit at Chhota Pipodara Govt. Primary School, students regained access to clean water for drinking, dishwashing, and handwashing. A student contribution model fostered ownership and responsibility. At Dalpura Govt. Primary School, a neglected library space was transformed with 480 new books and a dedicated 'School Library Committee' for maintenance. Students are now actively reading, with a goal of completing at least four books per month.

TEACHER TRAINING TO ELIMINATE EDUCATION INEQUITY | STATES - GUJARAT, WEST BENGAL

HDFC Bank Parivartan supports Teach To Lead's Fellowship, which brings top talent from premier universities and workplaces into under-resourced schools as full-time teachers. Fellows gain firsthand exposure to India's education challenges while working with students, principals, and parents. The programme develops leadership skills, fosters equity in education, and addresses the diverse needs of underserved students. It includes:

- Rigorous selection and six weeks of residential training in Pune
- Two years of full-time teaching in low-income schools
- Student vision-setting, teacher development, and assessments
- A strong alumni network driving systemic change in education

To address high dropout rates and unemployment, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Medhavi Foundation are empowering 3,600 disadvantaged youth in Maharashtra, Goa, and Gujarat. Key components include:

- Establishing centers of excellence in healthcare, hospitality, apparel, and logistics
- Integrating language proficiency modules and industry visits
- Providing simulated training and continuous technological upgrades
- Tailoring programmes to meet future skill requirements
- This initiative aims to bridge the skills gap and create sustainable employment opportunities.

BUILDING A SKILLED HEALTHCARE WORKFORCE

DISTRICTS - NAVSARI, RAJKOT

The collaboration between HDFC Bank Parivartan and Dr. Reddy's Foundation aims to provide high-quality training in healthcare to 720 youth from Gujarat, preparing them for the role of General Duty Assistants (GDAs). With a structured curriculum and hands-on training, participants will undergo 3 months of intensive learning, totaling 450 hours. Upon completion, the trainees will secure jobs. The long-term impact of the programme is significant, as it is expected that those who continue in their roles will see an increase of at least 50% in their family income. This initiative directly addresses the growing demand for skilled healthcare professionals in India, especially considering the post-pandemic healthcare boom.

| DISTRICT - AHMEDABAD

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with GCS Medical College, Hospital and Research Centre - a unit of Gujarat Cancer Society - is spearheading a transformative healthcare initiative in Ahmedabad. This project focuses on installing a state-of-the-art CT scan machine to enhance diagnostic capabilities for both inpatient and outpatient services.

KEY INTERVENTIONS

SAVING DISAPPEARING LIVELIHOODS ON A RIVER'S BANK

| DISTRICTS - KHEDA, PANCHMAHALS

Central Gujarat's expanding deep & narrow ravines are prone to mass erosion during monsoons - threatening the livelihoods of those living near them. To stop this phenomenon, HDFC Bank Parivartan along with Foundation for Ecological Security (FES) and Navinchandra Mafatlal Sadguru Water & Development Foundation constructed gabions to restrict flow & speed. Gabion structures are used for soil and water conservation. It is a welded wire cage or box filled with materials such as stone to stop runoff. About 55 gabion structures have been planned and 36 have been constructed. Due to these structures and other efforts like land levelling & tree plantation, today all beneficiaries experience reduced soil erosion & decreased spread of ravine toward the mainland.

SOLAR BASED IRRIGATION FOR DEVELOPMENT

| DISTRICT - KHEDA

In Dhundi village of Gujarat, 31 farmers have been positively impacted due to implementation of solar based irrigation. Today, 24 acres of farmland is sustainably cultivable. Inspired by this, 12 farmers have decided against having new borewells on their farmland, thus saving groundwater exploitation caused due to excessive drilling of borewells.

EMPOWERING 5,000 HOUSEHOLDS

DISTRICT - BANASKANTHA

Many villages in the region are currently grappling with depletion of natural resources, limited irrigation facilities and lack of market linkages to sell their produce. In addition, the unorganised communities and lack of adequate knowledge has added to their woes. HDFC Bank Parivartan and Collectives for Integrated Livelihood Initiatives (CInI) is working on water management in the area and training the farmers for its efficient utilisation.

- Developing water resources through harvesting and conservation techniques
- Bringing 440 acre of land under irrigation
- Promoting organic farming to improve soil health and productivity
- Strengthening farmers and institutions through training and capacity-building

The activation is expected to increase crop productivity average by 30-80%, ultimately leading to better returns for the farmer. Women farmer producer groups are also being formed to enhance market access. This will directly impact 5,000 households and 30,000+ individuals.

RESTORING BIO-DIVERSITY

DISTRICT - JAMNAGAR

With a vision of creating habitats that allow communities to be resilient to disasters, adapt to climate change, and thrive, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Aga Khan Agency for Habitat India are working to address the vulnerability of the project area to periodic cyclones and the salinity of cultivable lands. The plan involves planting mangroves in the coastal region, which can mitigate the effects of cyclonic storms and storm surges. Additionally, the mangroves can help reduce soil salinity, thereby enhancing soil fertility. The combination of salinity and storm surges has forced people to seek other income opportunities, such as labor or migration to other states. By establishing fruit-bearing plantations, the project can provide alternative livelihood options for these communities. Additionally, the intervention aims to install solar street lights, promote drip irrigation to improve soil health and water table, in the project villages. The impact is set to benefit nearly 15,000 individuals.

GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT FOR EFFECTIVE IRRIGATION

| DISTRICT - BHAVNAGAR

Agriculture in the coastal Saurashtra region is largely dependent on groundwater aquifers. Irrigation wells and prevailing farming practices have caused the withdrawal of a large quantity of groundwater making a large area susceptible to seawater intrusion. This excessive withdrawal is having a multiplier effect on the impacts of salinity ingress and groundwater quality deterioration. HDFC Bank Parivartan along with Coastal Salinity Prevention Cell is working on increasing water supply for irrigation in the area through Integrated Water Resource Management in 40 villages positively impacting nearly 25,000 individuals. Farmers will also be trained in the effective use of groundwater with storage and capacity enhancement. New check dams, farm ponds, well recharges, bore well recharges, and gabions will be constructed and old ones will be repaired.



STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

TRANSFORMING WASTE INTO WEALTH

| LOCATION - KUKASWADA VILLAGE, GUJARAT | BENEFICIARY - MOHANBHAI PANDIT

THE CHALLENGE

In Kukaswada, neglected cows wandered helplessly and cow dung piled up, turning what was once a symbol of prosperity into a growing problem. The community watched helplessly as waste mounted, land degraded, and livelihoods suffered. Among them was Mohanbhai Pandit, a farmer with six cows, who faced the painful reality of dwindling income and deteriorating animal welfare. Without resources or support, hope seemed out of reach.

OUR INTERVENTION

Change began when HDFC Bank Parivartan and the Ambuja Foundation partnered to build a Gaushala—a safe refuge for neglected cows. More than shelter, it brought innovation: cow dung was transformed into Ghanjivamrut, a rich organic fertilizer. Dedicated production units were set up, turning waste into a valuable asset and opening doors to sustainable income.

THE RESULT

Today, the Gaushala stands as a beacon of revival. Ghanjivamrut, sold at Rs.10 per kg—ten times the earlier price of raw dung—has created new income opportunities. Over 8 tons have already been sold, supporting both the Gaushala and local farmers.

From despair to dignity, Kukaswada's story proves that even the smallest change can sow seeds of hope and prosperity.

THE VENTURI SYSTEM REVOLUTION

| LOCATION - 55 VILLAGES OF MANGROL & MALIYA HATINA BLOCKS, JUNAGARH | BENEFICIARIES - 660 FARMERS

THE CHALLENGE

For organic farmers, every drop of nourishment mattered — yet applying bio-inputs like Jivamrut felt like a losing battle. Laborious, uneven, and wasteful, the manual process drained time and energy, often leaving crops thirsty and soil health compromised. Without a better way, the dream of truly sustainable farming remained just out of reach.

OUR INTERVENTION

To bridge this gap, HDFC Bank Parivartan and the Ambuja Foundation introduced a simple but transformative solution: the Venturi system. By seamlessly integrating with irrigation lines, it allowed bio-inputs to flow evenly across entire fields, eliminating the need for backbreaking manual application and ensuring that every inch of soil was enriched.

THE RESULT

The change was swift and powerful. Farmers reported lush, healthier crops, richer soils, and a dramatic reduction in labor. What once felt like an exhausting chore became an effortless, efficient process—ushering in a new era of sustainable and productive organic farming.

VAN CAMPAIGN FOR CHANGE

Parivartan and Ambuja Foundation launched a dynamic van campaign across 38 villages in Junagarh to raise awareness on soil health and animal husbandry. Over seven days, farmers learned sustainable agricultural practices, disease prevention for livestock, and improved soil management techniques. Engaging Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) materials and informative leaflets were distributed, ensuring knowledge reached every corner. This initiative not only educated farmers but also strengthened community engagement, making complex agricultural insights accessible in a short time.

FARM-TO-MARKET: BRINGING FARMERS & BANKERS TOGETHER

HDFC Bank staff from Junagadh, along with their families, visited the Parivartan project, interacting with beneficiary farmers and learning about sustainable interventions. A total of 115 participants, including 65 bank representatives, engaged in the event. An organic produce stall, featuring farmer-made products, generated sales of over Rs.60,000. This initiative not only fostered stronger connections between farmers and customers but also created valuable market linkages with bank representatives, opening new opportunities for sustainable growth.





TRAINING GOAT REARERS ON PPR VACCINATION

Goat rearing is a vital livelihood, yet many rearers lack awareness of the PPR vaccine, crucial for preventing deadly infections. HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with Aga Khan Rural Support Programme (India) - AKRSP(I), organised a workshop with a government veterinarian and Pashusakhis to educate 87 goat rearers on vaccination benefits. A hands-on field demonstration equipped Pashusakhis with practical skills in administering the vaccine, marking their first step toward independent livestock health management. While initial challenges in handling injections emerged, the training empowered them to safeguard animal health, ensuring better productivity and resilience for rural communities.



MILKING PROSPERITY: DAIRY MEETS DIGITAL

The Dairy Support Programme, a key CSR initiative under Financial Inclusion, bridges the gap between rural farmers and mainstream banking. By transitioning dairy payments from cash to digital banking, the programme enhances financial security, promotes savings habits, and builds credit history for farmers - especially women, who play a crucial role in dairy production.
