PROMOTING HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT IN RURAL COMMUNITIES | DISTRICT - GURUGRAM To address multifaceted challenges in Farrukh Nagar, Gurugram, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with The Hans Foundation, is implementing a comprehensive rural development project. 

TRANSFORMING COMMUNITIES THROUGH HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT | DISTRICT -MAHENDRAGARH

In Mahendragarh district, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with S M Sehgal Foundation, is launching a Holistic Rural Development Project to address environmental and socio-economic challenges. This initiative aims to benefit over 27,000 individuals from 15 villages through a range of integrated interventions. Key components include:

- Implementing renewable energy solutions, enhancing irrigation efficiency, and supporting sustainable farming practices.
- Establishing Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and providing training for community members.
- Setting up a polyhouse nursery for sapling production and conducting field demonstrations of climate-resilient technologies.
- Organising sanitation drives and community events to improve hygiene and water management.
- agriculture.

EMPOWERING RURAL COMMUNITIES THROUGH SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT | DISTRICT - NUH

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with S M Sehgal Foundation, is spearheading a project to drive holistic rural development in Nuh. This initiative focuses on improving livelihoods, education, and environmental sustainability across 15 villages. Key components include:

- Supporting 522 farmers with targeted interventions and establishing agro-horti models for chemical-free farming.
- Forming 15 Village Development Committees (VDCs) to strengthen community institutions.
- Transforming 8 schools into smart schools and providing educational infrastructure upgrades.
- Conducting animal health camps and promoting hygiene practices across the region.
- Equipping villages with solar street lights and solar spray pumps and planting trees to enhance green cover.

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TOMORROW | DISTRICT - NUH, REWARI, YAMUNA NAGAR AND MAHENDRAGARH

The hardships faced by girls trying to gain basic education has been holding back Haryana's communities from developing to their full potential. To promote gender inclusivity, Parivartan launched a programme ensuring academic, material & social/moral support. The initiative has facilitated their holistic development in the underdeveloped & remote areas of rural Haryana. It has successfully enrolled over 600 girls in formal education & has offered them a platform for comprehensive learning.

TURNING DISTANT DREAMS INTO REALITY **DISTRICT - SONIPAT**

To support students from disadvantaged sections of the state, HDFC Bank Parivartan - in partnership with Ashoka University - started a scholarship programme: an initiative that facilitated help for Young India Fellows (YIF) along with undergraduates who are unable to pay for their education. It is poised to be a game-changer in the lives of students aspiring to be successful in different streams.



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A COLOURFUL EDUCATION | DISTRICT - YAMUNA NAGAR, REWARI, NUH, MAHENDRAGARH With the aim of making elementary education fun & attractive, Parivartan has painted several Anagnwadis with BALA (Building as Learning Aid) art. Building upon children's attraction to colours, it is an innovative approach to education that displays topics in creative & fun ways on walls & other physical structures. Under Parivartan, the Bank has BALA-painted 14 Anganwadis across 10 of its project villages in Haryana.


TRANSFORMING EDUCATION THROUGH TECHNOLOGY | DISTRICT - SONIPAT, JHAJJAR, CHARKHI DADRI, MAHENDRAGARH, ROHTAK HDFC Bank Parivartan in association with Seva Sahyog Foundation is working on transforming 50 Government Schools spread over 25 cities/towns of Haryana. The project includes setting-up 150 smart classrooms along with maintaining libraries, science labs and sanitation facilities. As part of the intervention, 10th grade students will also get digital access to educational videos and assessments that are mapped to the Haryana State Board. Apart from changing the face of education through technology, on-site training to key stakeholders on the usage of the infrastructure as well as its integration in daily lectures also forms a part of the programme. The intervention will benefit over 25000 students and 1000 teachers.

Upskilling individuals to enable sustainable income generation

KEY INTERVENTIONS

UPSKILLING WOMEN

As part of its Sustainable Livelihood Initiative (SLI), Parivartan has imparted skill training to thousands of women across the state of Haryana.

PROVIDING SKILL-TRAINING TO RURAL YOUTH

Parivartan with Head Held High aims to build skills and capabilities of about 1500 disconnected rural youths across 10 districts of 10 states (Karnataka, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Telangana, Gujarat, Haryana, Odisha). The project also assures placement of at least 70% of the trained youth in a job within a period of 39 months. These locations have been selected due to the high concentration of underprivileged youth in these regions. The project is a part of core program of HHH called Make India Capable (MIC).

Focused on improving sanitation facilities & promoting safe hygiene practices across several communities

COMMUNITY SENSITISATION FOR BUILDING ZERO WASTE VILLAGES | DISTRICT - GURUGRAM Many villages lack waste management systems leading to pollution of water bodies and unhygienic conditions in living areas. HDFC Bank Parivartan in association with Hand in Hand Inclusive Development and Services (HHIDS) is working in the area of solid waste management in forty villages of the Sohna block. The intervention includes implementing an end-to-end plan to sensitise communities and establish facilities for material recovery and recycling. Awareness on source segregation, door to door waste collection and treatment of wet and dry waste will be undertaken to create an efficient waste management infrastructure. The intervention will also improve the livelihood of waste pickers and sanitary workers.

STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

BOOSTING AGRICULTURE THROUGH FARM MECHANISATION

LOCATION: MAHENDRAGARH BENEFICIARY: ISHWAR SINGH

THE CHALLENGE:

Ishwar Singh is a small-scale farmer from the Khampura village, earning his livelihood from his own ancestral land. However, he faced numerous challenges in making his agricultural venture financially sustainable. The lack of modern farming equipment and the heavy reliance on manual labour made it difficult for him to maximise his crop yields and income.

OUR INTERVENTION:

HDFC Bank Parivartan and SM Sehgal foundation supported Singh with a power weeder machine, which not only reduced the labour-intensive weeding work but also improved overall efficiency and productivity. He also started offering his services to other farmers at a nominal cost.

THE RESULT:

Over the course of a farming season, Ishwar Singh successfully weeded 22.5 acres of land for his fellow farmers using the power weeder machine. The income generated from this venture was a staggering 22,500 rupees, a substantial boost to his family's income and the overall economic well-being of the village. Ishwar's success story has inspired many others in village Khampura to explore innovative ways to improve their farming practices and income.





STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

SOLAR-POWERED IRRIGATION FOR SUSTAINABLE FARMING

LOCATION: NASIRBAS VILLAGE, FIROZPUR JHIRKA BLOCK, NUH DISTRICT **BENEFICIARY: JAHUL, A FARMER WITH FIVE ACRES OF LAND**

THE CHALLENGE:

Farmers in Nasirbas rely on electricity-operated tube wells for irrigation, but the erratic power supply forces them to water their crops during inconvenient hours. Diesel-powered pumps, an alternative, are expensive and polluting. Water shortages and unreliable energy sources led to challenges in maintaining crop yields.

OUR INTERVENTION:

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with S M Sehgal Foundation, launched a three-year development project that introduced solar-powered water pumps to promote sustainable irrigation. A demonstration was conducted, and Jahul was selected as the beneficiary. The project covered most of the pump's cost, with Jahul contributing Rs 88,500.

THE RESULT:

Since the installation, Jahul diversified into vegetable cultivation, increasing his profits significantly. His solar pump irrigated 34 acres of land for six other farmers, who also shifted to high-value crops like tomatoes and cauliflower. The shift to solar energy improved irrigation access, increased incomes, and reduced dependency on unreliable power sources.

PARIVARTAN AND THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Rural Development

Under Parivartan, the bank has been working in 17+ states in India to bring in holistic development in the rural landscape. It has launched the Holistic Rural Development Programme to address key challenges in rural areas.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

1. Promoting sustainable agriculture through better water management systems by construction of check dams, farm ponds, community ponds and irrigation systems.

2. Empowering farmers through capacity building. Creating Seed Bank, Grain Bank, Village Nursery and supporting field research to achieve food security.

SDG 6 ~ Clean Water and Sanitation

1. Ensuring availability of clean drinking water and promoting sustainable management of water through construction of Rainwater Harvesting Structures, Community Tanks, Hand Pumps and Wells.

SDG7 ~ Affordable and Clean Energy

1. Adopting renewable energy to provide affordable, reliable, sustainable and accessible modern energy through installation of Solar street lights, Biomass Stoves, Community Biogas Plants and Distribution of Solar Home Lights.





Skill Development and Livelihood Enhancement

Administering and enhancing skills is an essential component in increasing employment, ensuring fair share of work and creating sustainable livelihood opportunities. In addition, the bank also focusses on developing livelihood opportunities for women.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

1. HDFC Bank Parivartan has created non-farm based employee opportunities to double farmers' incomes. Using productive resources, farmers are trained on livestock management, thus, benefitting indigenous people, women and villagers.

2. The bank introduced kitchen gardens in villages in several states to promote sustainable agriculture and ensured improved nutrition to the families while successfully ending hunger. It has facilitated creation of over 40,000 kitchen gardens.

SDG4 ~ Quality Education

1. Under Parivartan, the bank is working to provide access to affordable, technical and vocational education. The bank has trained over 1.60 lakh individuals under its Skill Development programme keeping with principles of equity and inclusivity.

SDG5 ~ Gender Equality

1. Parivartan has formed/revived over 7,500 SHGs with an aim to empower women in rural India. The initiative has strengthened the cause of achieving gender equality by enabling the women to achieve better livelihood opportunities.

SDG8 ~ Decent Work and Economic Growth

1. The bank has trained over 1.04 lakh farmers through exposure visits and diverse agricultural training programmes for their sustained economic growth. Through varied capacity building initiatives, the farmers are able to seek full and productive employment.

2. Parivartan has empowered farmers through entrepreneurial programmes through financial as well as skill-based support. The bank has facilitated development of dairy cooperatives, poultry farms, integrated poultry-goat rearing-fishery units and other small business to ensure sustained and inclusive growth of the people as well as the region.

















SDG12 ~ Responsible Consumption and Production

1. Through natural farming, formation of seed banks and FPOs, Parivartan has been able to help farmers in innovating their logistics and supply chain, thus enabling sustainable consumption and production patterns.

Promotion of Education

This is one of the most important pillars of Parivartan that promotes equal education to all from early childhood to secondary education. The initiative also advocates usage of technology through digitisation of schools and introducing science labs to encourage the scientific temper of children.

SDG 4 ~ Quality Education

1. To further improve the access to inclusive and equitable quality education, the bank has undertaken several initiatives including remedial classes, learning camps, training the teachers and by offering scholarships. The bank has also created requisite infrastructure for students from underprivileged background to access education in a safe and lively environment.

SDG3 ~ Good Health and Well-Being for People

1. Parivartan has included sports as one of the fundamentals of education to ensure healthy lives of children while promoting their well-being. The bank has facilitated training of hockey, football and other sports while also ensuring access to the requisite sports equipment.

Healthcare and Hygiene

Our bank has actively worked towards providing better healthcare and sanitation facilities to the vulnerable communities. With its special focus in eradicating Non Communicable Diseases in certain states to building accessible sanitation facilities despite challenging terrains, the bank has set an example in the space.

SDG3 ~ Good Health and Well-Being for People

1. Under Parivartan, the bank has helped villagers create Kitchen Gardens to improve access to nutritious food and ensure healthy lives.

2. By organising health camps and health infrastructures the bank has adopted precautionary approach while helping vulnerable communities prevent themselves from communicable and non-communicable diseases. The bank has also set a Guinness World Record in organising largest blood donation drive.



SDG6 ~ Clean Water and Sanitation

1. With creation of over 28,800 sanitation units across India, the bank has been steadfast in giving access to clean sanitation facilities for all despite terrain related changes. By making adequate and equitable sanitation accessible, the bank has helped end Open Defecation and offered women their dignified access to sanitation.

SDG13 ~ Climate Action

1. The bank has initiated a mass plantation drive and by far planted over 10 lakh trees as one of its urgent actions to combat climate change. The drive has also contributed in increasing the ground water levels and improved agriculture.

Financial Literacy and Inclusion

Financial literacy is the first step towards real financial inclusion. Our Bank conducts financial literacy workshops for communities to enable them to make smart financial decisions and sustain themselves.


SDG8 ~ Decent Work and Economic Growth
