KEY INTERVENTIONS

DOUBLING INCOME THROUGH SUSTAINABILITY

| DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, BIDAR, YADGIRI, KOPPAL, UTTAR KANNADA, RAICHUR, VIJAYAPURA

Over 80% of farmers in the region are small and underserved, making agriculture-based income crucial for their prosperity. Under the Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP), HDFC Bank Parivartan along with BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development (BISLD), Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA), Action for Food Production and Watershed Organization Trust introduced organic farming to reduce input costs. Initiatives like vermi-composting, natural pest control, and advanced technologies - such as nanoparticle-based solutions and pheromone traps - helped lower expenses further. The Bank also supported farm pond construction, ensuring year-round water availability, boosting productivity, and enabling income diversification through aquaculture. These efforts have strengthened rural resilience, improved food security, and promoted sustainable agriculture, transforming the lives of small farmers.

HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT THROUGH AGRICULTURE

| DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIRI, BIDAR, KOPPAL, RAICHUR, VIJAYAPURA

HDFC Bank Parivartan, along with BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development (BISLD), Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA), Action for Food Production and Watershed Organization Trust introduced a three-pronged approach in the region to uplift rural communities. Farmers' incomes improved through high-yield seed adoption, while check dams, farm ponds, and earthen bunds enhanced watershed support. Previously barren land was cultivated, and trees were planted, restoring vegetation. To ensure long-term impact, farmers received training in sustainable and organic farming practices, equipping them with the skills for a more resilient future.

SEEDS FOR A BETTER YIELD

| DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIRI, BIDAR

With rain-fed agriculture dominating the region, climate change has led to water scarcity and frequent crop failures. Local pulse and oilseed varieties are particularly vulnerable to diseases, further threatening farmers' livelihoods. To address this, HDFC Bank Parivartan along with Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA) provided high-quality Bengal Gram and groundnut seeds to farmers. Additionally, training on improved farming practices helped strengthen crop resilience and boost yields, ensuring better agricultural sustainability and income security.





BUILDING CLIMATE-RESILIENT FARMING COMMUNITIES | DISTRICT - KOPPAL

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development (BISLD), is transforming 10 villages into Climate-Smart Villages by equipping over 1,000 farmers with sustainable, climate-resilient agricultural practices. The initiative focuses on soil restoration, water resource management, livestock development, and boosting red gram cultivation through improved practices and high-yield GRG-811 seeds across 660 acres. Digital advisory support via Indian Farmers Fertilizer Cooperative Limited (IFFCO) KISAN enables 461 farmers to access real-time insights and end-to-end traceability for better decision-making. Strengthening Farmer Producer Companies (FPCs) and delivering hands-on training ensures long-term impact, improved yields, and economic stability—paving the way for self-sustaining rural prosperity.

CREATING A SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD

DISTRICTS - HASSAN, SHIMOGA, CHIKMAGALUR

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with the Industree Crafts Foundation, empowered 1,200 bamboo farmers by promoting sustainable cultivation. The programme included farmer training, sapling distribution, vermicompost support, baseline data collection, and FSC certification. By linking farmers to off-farm enterprises and global markets, the initiative ensured sustainable livelihoods and increased incomes.

EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES THROUGH HOLISTIC TRANSFORMATION

| DISTRICT - VIJAYAPURA

To strengthen climate resilience and promote sustainable livelihoods, a comprehensive initiative is being implemented in the Taluka Talikoti region. Led by HDFC Bank Parivartan in collaboration with Watershed Organisation Trust (WOTR), the project supports 3,153 households across 12 villages through watershed development, water harvesting, and training in sustainable agriculture. Key interventions include creating rainwater harvesting structures, desilting of tanks, efficient irrigation techniques, and community capacity building. Additionally, the initiative fosters non-farm livelihood opportunities, empowering women and rural communities with skill development for long-term economic stability.

UPLIFTMENT OF FARMING & FISHING COMMUNITIES

DISTRICTS - UTTARA KANNADA, UDUPI

Across 25 villages, fishing and farming communities struggled with declining incomes, with the Siddi community facing additional challenges due to forest access restrictions. HDFC Bank Parivartan and Manuvikasa stepped in, establishing a honey cluster, distributing 648 bee boxes, and setting up a processing unit to ensure sustainable honey cultivation. Beyond beekeeping, the initiative supported 900 families with poultry, trained villagers in horticulture and fish-based food production, and empowered 99 women to launch small businesses. Additionally, 69 youth gained hospitality skills, opening doors to new livelihood opportunities.

INTEGRATED LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT FOR ECONOMIC ADVANCEMENT

| DISTRICTS - HAVERI, DHARWAD, DAVANGERE, GADAG, VIJAYAPURA, BAGALKOTE, BALLARY, BELGAUM

HDFC Bank Parivartan and BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development (BISLD) launched a livestock development and farmer training program across 600 villages. It introduced breed improvement, AI technician training, and livestock health interventions like deworming and infertility treatments. Farmers learned better feed management, while 50 Cattle Breeding Centers supported more than 2500 breedable cattle, boosting incomes through improved livestock care.

EMPOWERING RURAL COMMUNITIES WITH HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT

| DISTRICT - RAICHUR

Bridging gaps in rural development, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with Action for Food Production (AFPRO), is implementing a comprehensive initiative across 14 villages in Maski block. The initiative enhances livelihoods by expanding cultivation, promoting chemical-free farming, increasing farmer incomes, and supporting women-led enterprises. It also upgrades government schools with smart classrooms and fosters sustainability through solar streetlights, rainwater harvesting, and eco-friendly farming. Impacting over 8,000 individuals, this initiative addresses key socio-economic and environmental challenges for lasting progress.

CULTIVATING CHANGE IN RURAL COMMUNITIES | DISTRICT - BIDAR

Empowering rural communities through financial literacy and sustainable development, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with Mysore Resettlement And Development Agency (MYRADA), is fostering economic growth in underserved areas. The initiative supports 4,202 households by improving agricultural productivity, promoting organic farming, and introducing modern tools like drip irrigation and power sprayers. Farmers receive training in sustainable practices, financial inclusion, and market access. The programme also strengthens Self Help Groups (SHGs) and village federations, enhances education through school upgrades, and promotes women-led enterprises, ensuring long-term social and economic impact.

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA), BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development (BILSD) and Action for Food Production (AFPRO), has upgraded schools into smart schools by providing tech-enabled classrooms, STEM labs, libraries and upgrading basic infrastructure, transforming the learning environment to improve learning level outcomes.

IMPROVING ANGANWADIS FOR EXCELLENCE IN CHILDCARE

| DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIRI, BIDAR, RAICHUR

Improvement in the management and infrastructure of anganwadis for better learning and childcare is needed if their parents have to work without worry. HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA), launched an intervention to upgrade the anganwadis in 5 villages of Aland Block and 10 villages of Mundargi and Varknalli gram panchayats of Yadgiri district. Playing material, chair, tables, floormats, toys wardrobes and water purifiers were provided to the centres. Walls have been dotted with colourful posters of fruits and vegetables, flowers, names of months and days. Informative charts and education posters have been displayed on the walls. Minor repairers of the Anganwadi Center (AWC), painting, educational wall write ups and decoration with child friendly themes was undertaken, benefiting more than 150 children. Today parents, teachers and children are happy with the new improved state of these care centres. The admissions have gone up and learning quality has also improved. For example, the number of regular children at Mustur AWC has increased from 18 to 32 in just two months of the intervention.

SMART SCHOOLS SMARTER FUTURES

| DISTRICTS - BAGALKOT, BIDAR, GADAG, KOLAR, KOPPAL, RAICHUR, TUMKUR, VIJAYAPURA, GULBARGA

Enhancing educational access, a new initiative is transforming learning for 3,500 students across 10 schools in rural and semi-urban areas. In partnership with the National Agro Foundation, HDFC Bank Parivartan is bridging the gap between government and minority schools and modern educational resources. The project includes:

- Establishing STEM labs to foster innovation and scientific curiosity
- Set up libraries in all 10 schools to promote reading and self-learning
- Installing drinking water facilities for access to clean water
- Renovating toilets to improve hygiene and school conditions
- Upgrading classrooms to create better learning environments

Advancing inclusive education, a new initiative is enhancing learning opportunities for 30 differently-abled students at Umeed Asha Kiran School. In collaboration with the National Agro Foundation, HDFC Bank Parivartan is modernising infrastructure to create an engaging and accessible learning environment. The project includes:

- Setting up two smart classrooms with interactive learning tools
- Enhancing classroom conditions with better lighting, fans, and window screens
- Installing five sets of benches and desks for student comfort
- Conducting minor repairs to doors and windows for improved safety

Enhancing medical education through technology, a new initiative is set to upgrade learning at the Gadag Institute of Medical Sciences (GIMS). In collaboration with the National Agro Foundation, HDFC Bank Parivartan is establishing a state-of-the-art smart classroom to equip future healthcare professionals with cutting-edge resources. Benefiting around 200 students annually, the project includes:

- An 86-inch interactive flat panel with 4K resolution for immersive learning
- OPS (i5, 11th gen) and 4K VC Camera for high-quality instruction
- Wireless screen sharing and bluetooth connectivity for seamless interaction
- Noise-reducing lapel microphone and lecture recording software
- Customised sliding panelling, wall-mounted boards, and lockable cabinets for enhanced functionality

| DISTRICT - BELGAUM

Bringing the future of military education to the Maratha Light Infantry Regimental Centre (MLIRC), this initiative is set to revolutionise training methods. With cutting-edge smart classrooms, recruits and officers will engage with interactive content, real-time simulations, and advanced audio-visual tools. Key highlights include:

- 1,000 cadets to benefit directly from tech-enhanced learning
- 25 smart interactive panels boosting instructional efficiency
- UPS-backed system ensuring uninterrupted training sessions
- Improved operational preparedness through immersive simulations

BUILDING CAREERS FOR A STRONGER TOMORROW

| DISTRICTS - BAGALKOT, BELGAUM, DHARWAD, GADAG, KOPPAL, RAICHUR, UTTARA KANNADA

The collaboration between HDFC Bank Parivartan and Deshpande Foundation focuses on empowering rural youth across North Karnataka by providing skill training and enhancing employability through the SkillPlus programme. By targeting college youth aged 18-25 years, the project aims to equip over 2400 youth with domain-specific and soft skills, preparing them for the workforce and improving their career prospects. The initiative, spread across 120 SkillPlus Centres in colleges, not only enhances the employability of underserved communities but also directly supports the government's vision of a developed India. This partnership seeks to create a tangible impact by ensuring that over 75% of the graduates secure placements.

EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH CMRC

| DISTRICTS - BIDAR, GULBARGA, YADGIRI

HDFC Bank Parivartan and Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA) worked on creating economic opportunities through the Local Economic Activation (LEA) intervention, which comprises at least 50% women. Community Managed Resource Centres (CMRCs) were created under the programme to provide economic opportunities to the villagers. Forming federations/groups also made it easy for the members to seek financial assistance, credit & market linkages. In addition, livelihood enhancement programmes were introduced to diversify the livelihood portfolio of the households in target villages. Non-farm based opportunities - including backyard poultries, goat-rearing, chili powder processing etc - helped create alternative livelihood options.

GENERATING INCOME FOR WOMEN

| DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, BIDAR, YADGIRI, RAICHUR

HDFC Bank Parivartan understands that in order to ensure a sustainable future for India's rural communities, its women need to achieve financial independence. To that end, the Bank along with Mysore Resettlement and Development Agency (MYRADA) and Action for Food Production has provided support to numerous women's groups engaged in agricultural or non-agricultural activities in Karnataka. For example, sewing machines were provided to 32 trained women in 16 different villages; while chili powder processing machines were provided to 16 women from these very villages. Total 150 women have been trained and provided assistance. As a result, their incomes have increased significantly, thus inspiring many others to seek their own financial independence as well.

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with Deshpande Foundation, is equipping rural graduates with the skills needed to thrive in today's job market. Enhancing employment opportunities for rural youth, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Deshpande Foundation are setting up an IT Skills Lab at Deshpande Skill Centre. This initiative will upgrade existing facilities and add over 600 desktops for skill training over the next 3-4 years. With a focus on holistic development, the centre will train 7,000+youth in BFSI, Teacher Training, IT & ITeS, Electronics, and Manufacturing. Each course, spanning 3-5 months, will combine technical and soft skills to improve employability and livelihoods.

The programme includes 180 hours of training in data analytics, Business Process Management, BFSI, and soft skills, alongside nationally recognized certifications. It ensures strong placement support in deep tech and other sectors, with post-placement monitoring for six months to aid career growth and stability.

STRENGTHENING CRITICAL CARE SERVICES AT BAGCHI-PARTHASARATHY HOSPITAL DISTRICT - BENGALURU

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Science, is supporting the development of key medical services at the Bagchi-Parthasarathy Hospital. The project focuses on establishing the emergency medicine, cardiology, and radiology departments by funding essential medical equipment and covering critical pre-operational costs. These departments are integral to delivering timely and specialised healthcare services. The initiative aims to strengthen the hospital's infrastructure and improve access to advanced medical care, especially for underserved communities. Once operational, the facility is expected to serve as a vital healthcare hub, fostering research, training, and quality patient care.

EMPLOYING WATERSHED MANAGEMENT TECHNIQUES FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVING

DISTRICTS - CHIKKABALLAPURA

Villages in Sidlaghatta and Bagepalli blocks have long faced acute water scarcity, impacting both households and agriculture. HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with the Foundation for Ecological Security (FES), is addressing this challenge by restoring 150 water bodies and recharging aquifers to ensure year-round water availability. In the district, the initiative has also developed 8 check dams, renovated 200 water bodies, and improved canals, collectively rejuvenating over 6,000 acres of farmland. These efforts are resulting in higher crop yields for more than 600 farmers and better livelihoods for nearly 8,000 families.

ENHANCING VEGETATION BY TACKLING WATER SCARCITY AND SOIL EROSION

DISTRICT - UTTARA KANNADA

To combat agricultural and environmental challenges, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with the BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development, is implementing a natural resource management project. The initiative focuses on water conservation through trench cum bunds, staggered bunds, step bunds, and CCT structures. Check dams, gabion structures, and loose boulder structures are being built to support water management, alongside farm and percolation pond excavation to recharge groundwater. Regular soil testing, borewell recharging, composting, and biomass production are enhancing soil health. Additionally, horticulture, mixed cropping, floriculture, and sustainable pest control using solar insect traps are boosting agricultural productivity and income.



STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

FROM CRANE OPERATOR TO DAIRY INNOVATOR

LOCATION - LAKKAMPURA, JAGALUR TALUKA, DAVANGERE BENEFICIARY - M. KOTRESH

THE CHALLENGE


After six years as a crane operator, Kotresh returned to his five-acre farm, hoping for stability. But setbacks followed - his cows were stolen, government's Artificial Insemination (AI) services led to eight male calves, and he unknowingly sold farmyard manure instead of using it to enrich his land. Struggling to make ends meet, he felt trapped in an endless cycle of hardship.

OUR INTERVENTION

HDFC Bank Parivartan along with BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development supported the Cattle Breeding Centre in Gadimakunte village, which provides AI services to Lakkampura and surrounding areas. With guidance from AI technician Badappa, Kotresh adopted sorted semen AI services, leading to four female calves and improved herd productivity. He began cultivating BNH-10 fodder on 0.5 acres, supplying fodder cuttings to neighbors and promoting sustainable practices. Awareness sessions helped him understand the value of FYM, which he now uses to enhance soil fertility and crop yield. His milk yield increased to 20 liters per day, and by collecting and selling milk from neighboring farmers, he built an additional revenue stream.

THE RESULT

Kotresh's farm flourished. His improved cattle management boosted milk yield and quality, inspiring other farmers to adopt better practices. With higher earnings from milk and manure sales, he reduced dependency on agriculture, ensuring a balanced and sustainable livelihood. Now, he plans to expand his dairy business, build a larger shed, and invest in a chaff cutter-proof that resilience and the right support can turn struggle into success.

A HOMEMAKER'S JOURNEY TO FINANCIAL INDEPENDENCE

LOCATION - VARKNALLI, YADGIRI DISTRICT BENEFICIARY - MRS. JAYAMMA

THE CHALLENGE

Jayamma's world revolved around her family, relying entirely on her husband's modest income from a clothing store. Financial struggles deepened with her mother-in-law's prolonged illness and her father-in-law's inability to work. With five family members to support and no stable source of income, survival became a daily challenge.

OUR INTERVENTION

Determined to take control of her future, Jayamma joined the Sri Atamalinga Self Help Group (SHG) in 2022. Through the HDFC Bank Parivartan HRDP initiative, she accessed a Rs.10,000 loan from the Revolving Fund. With this support, she expanded her small grocery store, stocking more essentials and attracting more customers.

THE RESULT

Her earnings surged from Rs.4,000 to Rs.10,000 a month, bringing stability to her household. She now repays her loan with ease while securing a brighter future for her family. More than just financial independence, Jayamma has gained confidence and a new sense of purpose. Inspired by her journey, she actively mobilises other women in her village to join SHGs, proving that a little support can spark a powerful transformation.


