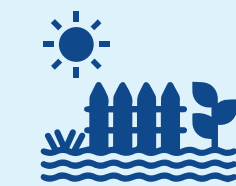

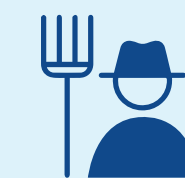

IMPACT IN KARNATAKA

RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Promoting holistic rural development of communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

Despite most areas of Karnataka having access to water for agricultural purposes & also the requisite infrastructure, there are some regions that continue to suffer droughts. The situation is particularly bad in a few districts, including Bidar & Gulbarg. Although there are a few areas in these regions that are irrigated, better agricultural infrastructure remains the need of the hour.

Taking a comprehensive look of the entire situation, HDFC Bank Parivartan decided to empower & develop communities in a sustainable manner. Under the **Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP)**, the Bank focuses on:

- Natural Resource Management (NRM)
- Health & hygiene
- Skill development
- Education promotion

While managing the resources helped increase the ground water level, improved crop yield & made water available for irrigation, other initiatives focused on enabling the villagers to become entrepreneurial & financially independent.

DOUBLING INCOME THROUGH SUSTAINABILITY | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, BIDAR, YADGIRI, KOPAL, UTTAR KANNADA

A farmer's income mainly comprises income from wages, the net receipt of cultivation & agri-based activities. However, over 80% of farmers are small & marginalised. Hence, implementing strategies to improve agriculture-based income will bring prosperity to a majority of them. The programmes focus on:

- Reducing farm input expenses
- Training farmers
- Capacity building
- Increasing water availability
- Increasing productivity
- Supporting primary value addition to production & marketing.

Under the Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP), the Bank introduced organic farming as an intervention that could reduce farmer input costs. Promoting vermi-composting & methods to naturally control pests also saved up on what would otherwise be spent on purchasing chemical pesticides. In addition, technological interventions including weeding & power sprayer equipment, pheromone traps to reduce pesticides & nanoparticle technology were introduced to reduce expenses even further.

The Bank has supported the small and marginal farmers in constructing farm ponds that marked a significant advancement in agricultural sustainability and water management. These ponds helped mitigate water scarcity, enabling year-round crop cultivation and supporting the adoption of innovative farming practices such as integrated systems and agroforestry. In addition to ensuring food security, the ponds provided opportunities for income diversification through aquaculture activities. Serving multiple purposes, including livestock and domestic water supply, these farm ponds played a crucial role in fostering rural development, resilience, and sustainable agriculture, while meeting the diverse needs of rural households and improving overall farm productivity.





HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT THROUGH | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIRI, BIDAR, KOPAL

Parivartan launched a holistic three pronged approach to help rural populations in project areas. Incomes of 12120 farmers increased due to agricultural interventions like usage of high yielding variety seeds. Construction of check dams, farm ponds and earthen bunds provided better watershed support to farmers. 4305 acres of previously uncultivated land was brought under vegetation and 2000 trees were planted. To upskill the rural population, farmers were trained in sustainable agriculture and organic farming practices.

SEEDS FOR A BETTER YIELD | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIRI, BIDAR

Agriculture in the districts of Gulbarga & Bidar is largely rain-fed, thus resulting in the popularity of pulse & oilseed crops. However, owing to climate change-related issues, this very rain has become increasingly scarce - often to the point of creating drought-like conditions throughout the season. In addition, the local varieties of these crops are largely susceptible to viral diseases, resulting in crippling crop failures.

The Bank hence provided high quality Bengal Gram seeds to 200 of these farmers, while 120 of them were provided with groundnut seeds. In addition, they were also taught better management practices in order to improve the resilience of their crops & thus increase their yields.





A SUSTAINABLE CLIMATE-SMART VILLAGE | DISTRICT - KOPPAL

10 villages in the Koppal district of Karnataka have been chosen by Parivartan for its **Climate Smart Village development project**. The initiative is centered on the promotion of climate smart farming techniques that involve the requisite agricultural technology, water resource development & livestock development. Undertaken in order to counter contemporary climate-related challenges such as soil degradation & droughts, the project aims at:

- Promoting climate-resilient agriculture to ensure higher productivity of the selected crops
- Enabling digital advisory services to enhance the productivity of major pulses, cereals & millets grown in the area
- Establishing a robust value chain in pulses & millets through vibrant Farmer Producer Companies (FPCs)

The initiative - promoted through field schools & hand-holding support - will focus directly on **1,000 marginal farmers** in the region, though its impact is predicted to benefit **over twice as many farmers** indirectly once self-sustainable.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE PRACTICES | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIR, BIDAR

Parivartan with KVK Gulbarga provided training to 80 farmers from 16 villages. The beneficiaries were provided training in varied areas like SAP, testing of soil health, vermi-composting, vermi-wash, intercropping, pest control, organic farming, dairy development, poultry and goat rearing. Additionally, agriculture experts trained 64 farmers through capacity building and demonstration. The programme included increasing awareness on the importance of ajola, soil testing, dashaparani, panchamrut, jeevamrut, beejamruthand and trees. This has reduced the chemical fertiliser cost incurred by farmers, thus increasing their income and reducing expenses.





IMPROVING RED GRAM CULTIVATION | DISTRICT - KOPPAL

Red gram is a commonly cultivated and consumed pulse crop in Koppal region. But the production rates are not good. Parivartan with BILSD worked across 10 villages with an aim to improve production rates. The beneficiaries were trained and made aware about production enhancement techniques. Additionally, for a better understanding these techniques were also demonstrated. The farmer training included productivity enhancement, POP training and educating them about salient features of GRG-811 variety of red gram. 440 farmers were positively impacted covering an area of 660 acres.

DIGITAL ADVISORY SUPPORT | DISTRICT - KOPPAL

Parivartan with BILSD provided digital advisory support to 461 farmers in 10 project villages. They were trained on receiving information on farm operations, organic farming techniques through profiling, analysing and disseminating the farm details via IFFCO KISAN. All beneficiaries now receive end to end traceability and advisory services.

INSTALLING SOLAR STREET LIGHTS | DISTRICT - KOPPAL

In Muradi cluster of Koppal district electricity was constantly fluctuating throughout the day and night. Streets, households and colonies did not have sufficient light at night which hindered children and women from moving around post sunset. Parivartan along with BILSD identified villages that needed better facilities with the help of local Panchayat members, FPO members and SHGs. Following this 100 solar street lights were installed.





EMPLOYING WATERSHED MANAGEMENT TECHNIQUES FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVING | DISTRICT - CHIKKABALLAPURA

40,000 households in the villages in Sidlaghatta and Bagepalli blocks and 8000 households in Chikkaballapura district faced chronic water shortage for household use as well as for irrigation, as the areas lay in a rain shadow region. HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with FES, restored 150 local water bodies and recharged groundwater aquifers, using local manpower in Sidlaghatta and Bagepalli blocks resulting in yearwide availability of water and that too with improved quality in these villages. In Chikkaballapura district, construction of 8 check dams, renovation of 200 water bodies across 150 villages, widening of existing canal structures, removal of silt, restoration of catchment areas and damaged water bodies was successfully completed, resulting in providing 6000 acres of land with water, improving the productivity for 600 + farmers due to rising soil moisture and improving the incomes of 8000 families.

UPLIFTMENT OF FARMING & FISHING COMMUNITIES | DISTRICTS - UTTARA KANNADA, UDUPI

The farming & fishing communities across 25 villages of Uttara Kannada and Udupi districts faced a loss of livelihood due to lack of availability of fish and an acute lack of supporting infrastructure. This included the Siddi community, with its roots in Africa, who migrated to India during the British rule. Traditionally they were engaged in agriculture, forest product collection and excelled in honey collection. However, unscientific honey collection methods over the past decade led to restrictions on their forest access. HDFC Bank Parivartan supported in establishing a honey cluster among Siddi families, by providing bee boxes, honey processing unit and enabling sustainable honey cultivation. Additionally, they were also provided with resources like Areca saplings, irrigation materials and fencing for small land holdings. Villagers from other parts of the districts were also trained to add skills like horticulture, poultry, making fish related food products and hospitality. As part of the intervention, 900 families received poultry supplies, 648 honey bee boxes were distributed among 162 people and 1 honey processing unit was established. 69 youngsters were also provided with a crash course in hospitality. Further, 99 women were provided financial support to set up ventures like grocery shops, beauty parlours and garment units.





INCREASE IN GREEN COVER

HDFC Bank's WBO department, has planted 26,500 saplings across five states. The trees planted are indigenous which will support local biodiversity, thus, improving the overall ecosystem. This will help absorb carbon dioxide considerably and curb soil erosion by increasing green cover and create a carbon sink to purify the air and reduce harmful particulate matter in cities which will lead to reduction in global warming. It will also rejuvenate soil quality and reduce erosion which will enhance the ecosystem.

ENHANCING VEGETATION BY TACKLING WATER SCARCITY AND SOIL EROSION

| DISTRICTS - UTTARA KANNADA

To address agricultural and environmental challenges in Uttara Kannada, the BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development, in collaboration with HDFC Bank Parivartan, is implementing a project aimed at improving natural resource management and enhancing vegetation. Key components include:

- Implementing water conservation measures such as building trench cum bunds, staggered bunds, step bunds, and CCT structures.
- Constructing check dams, gabion structures, and loose boulder structures to support water management.
- Excavating farms and percolation ponds to recharge groundwater and improve irrigation capabilities.
- Conducting regular soil testing and recharging defunct borewells to enhance soil health.
- Promoting composting and biomass production for organic fertilizer and green manure.
- Introducing horticulture plots, mixed crops, and floriculture to diversify and improve agricultural productivity.
- Supporting vegetable and fodder production to increase income and resource efficiency.
- Installing solar insect traps for sustainable pest management.

This initiative aims to overcome water scarcity and soil erosion issues, improve groundwater levels, and expand irrigation, thereby fostering sustainable agricultural practices and enhancing income in the region.





INTEGRATED LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT FOR ECONOMIC ADVANCEMENT | DISTRICTS - HAVERI, DHARWAD, DAVANGERE, GADAG, VIJAYAPURA, BAGALKOTE, BALLARY, BELGAUM
 HDFC Bank Parivartan rolled out an integrated livestock development and farmer training program in 500 villages across 8 districts. It included initiatives like breed improvement techniques and training farmers for better livestock management practices. An artificial insemination program was launched and locals were trained to become AI technicians. Several livestock health interventions like deworming, animal infertility treatments were made available. Farmers were informed about animal feed management for increased yield. 50 Cattle Breeding Center (CBCs) were established across these 8 districts to help 2500 breedable cattle. Livestock farmers have been able to increase their incomes by managing their animals better.



CREATING A SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD | DISTRICTS - HASSAN, SHIMOGA, CHIKMAGALUR
 Parivartan with the Indus Tree Foundation with the aim to strengthen integrated community-based structures and create sustainable livelihoods aided 1200 bamboo farmers from Hassan, Shimoga and Chikmagalur districts. The interventions of the programme involved:

- Mobilisation and training of bamboo farmers on sustainable cultivation practices
- Purchase and distribution of new bamboo saplings for plantation
- Providing fertilisers like vermicompost
- Baseline data collection
- FPO (Farmer Producer Organizations) registration for farmers
- FSC certification of bamboo plantations
- Connecting farmers to off-farm enterprises and other markets

This will help the beneficiaries to integrate with international supply chains that demand sustainable production and harvesting. Thus, providing 1200 farmers a sustainable livelihood and sizable income.





PROMOTION OF EDUCATION

Creating a conducive learning environment in communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION | DISTRICTS - BIDAR, GULBARGA,

Although the number of students in rural government schools is rising, the quality of education provided by them hasn't improved proportionately. Students who have passed 5th grade find it difficult to solve simple mathematical problems of grades lower than theirs. In addition, their ability to read & solve problems also declines instead of improving with every passing grade.

IMPROVING ANGANWADIS FOR EXCELLENCE IN CHILDCARE | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, YADGIRI, BIDAR

The state of government-run anganwadis in rural regions leaves a lot to be desired. Improvement in the management and infrastructure of anganwadis for better learning and childcare opportunities for children is needed if their parents have to work without worry. HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with MYRADA, launched an intervention to upscale the anganwadis in five villages of Aland Block and 10 villages of Mundargi and Varknalli GPs of Yadgiri district. Playing material, chair, tables, floormats, toys wardrobes and water purifiers were provided to the centres. Walls have been dotted with colourful posters of fruits and vegetables, flowers, names of months and days. Informative charts and education posters have been displayed on the walls. Minor repairs of the AWC, painting, educational wall write ups and decoration with child friendly themes was undertaken in these anganwadis, benefiting more than 150 children. Today parents, teachers and children are happy with the new improved state of these care centres. The admissions have gone up and learning quality has also improved. For example, the number of regular children at Mustur AWC has increased from 18 to 32 in just two months of the intervention.

BUILDING STEM CAPABILITIES IN RURAL INDIA THROUGH SMART EDUCATION

To ensure adequate development of IT infrastructure in rural India and make the next generation future ready, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with Save the Children Foundation launched an intervention to turn 300 government schools into SMART Schools. The project will benefit 1,25,274 students from grades 1 to 10 and also involve their parents, 5175 teachers, 300 headmasters and 2,429 SDMC members through direct engagement. The initiative involves equipping schools with SMART classrooms and providing them with computers, projectors, specialised software, audience response technology, assistive listening devices, networking, and audio / visual capabilities and resources.

ENSURING SEAMLESS EDUCATION THROUGH SOLAR POWER | DISTRICTS - BIDAR, GULBARGA, YADGIR

Many children in Karnataka weren't able to study after sunset due to the unavailability of consistent electricity supply. Parivartan along with MYRADA provided 500 children from 25 anganwadis with solar lamps, to ensure seamless studying. This has provided children a better environment to study and allowed them to perform better academically.





SKILL TRAINING AND LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT

Upskilling individuals to enable sustainable income generation

KEY INTERVENTIONS

EMPOWERMENT THROUGH VOCATIONAL TRAINING | DISTRICTS - BIDAR, GULBARGA, YADGIRI, UTTAR KANNADA, UDUPI

Skill training is one of the most effective ways to improve the socio-economic condition of underprivileged communities. With an aim to make employment a reality for the youth from these communities, Parivartan has undertaken a focused programme of upskilling in Karnataka. The **comprehensive skill training programme** develops market-driven skills which is a major contributor to a candidate's success. Executed with a scientific approach, potential candidates are sequentially selected through intensive community scouting, after which they're counselled & encouraged to be a part of the programme.

EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH CMRC | DISTRICTS - BIDAR, GULBARGA, YADGIRI

Parivartan worked on creating economic activities through the **Local Economic Activation (LEA)** intervention, which comprises at least 50% women. **Community Managed Resource Centres (CMRCs)** were created under the programme to provide economic opportunities to the villagers. Forming federations/groups also made it easy for the members to seek financial assistance, credit & market linkages. In addition, livelihood enhancement programmes were introduced to diversify the livelihood portfolio of the households in target villages. Non-farm based opportunities - including backyard poultries, goat-rearing, chili powder processing etc - helped create alternative livelihood options.

GENERATING INCOME FOR WOMEN | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, BIDAR, YADGIR

Parivartan understands that in order to ensure a sustainable future for India’s rural communities, its women need to achieve financial independence. To that end, the Bank has provided support to numerous women’s groups engaged in agricultural or non-agricultural activities in Karnataka. For example, sewing machines were provided to 32 trained women in 16 different villages; while chili powder processing machines were provided to 16 women from these very villages Total 150 women have been trained and provided assistance. As a result, their incomes have increased significantly, thus inspiring many others to seek their own financial independence as well.

DEVELOPING SKILLS IN RURAL YOUTH TO MAKE THEM EMPLOYMENT-READY

To ensure adequate development of a future-ready workforce from amongst the marginalised rural youth, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with Deshpande Skilling Centre launched an intervention to train 100,000 graduates from 20 districts of Karnataka and Telangana, over the next 7 years, by imparting skills that will make them employment- ready. Female candidates have been given adequate representation in the selection of trainees. The project will benefit 10,000 villages and offer employment opportunities to at least 70% of the trained youth. So far 3,601 graduates have been enrolled and another batch of 1,000 students is being enrolled in the year 2023-2024. Collaborations with organisations like Hinduja Global Solutions, Wistron, Tata Consultancy Services and Omega Health Care have facilitated employment opportunities for the trainees. So far, 2,736 students have secured job placements. The intervention is supported by another project ‘Enabling Digital Skills for Employability’ to equip the rural youth in North Karnataka with digital skills that enhance their employability. Several IT labs with a total of 600 desktop computers have been set up. These labs serve as learning centres for the youth.





IT SKILL TRAINING WITH EFFECTIVE INFRASTRUCTURE TO STUDENTS | DISTRICT - HUBALLI

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with Deshpande Foundation, is establishing an IT Skills Lab at Deshpande Skill Centre to help the local youth have access to increased opportunities for employment and ensure improvement in livelihoods. Many existing facilities at the lab will be refurbished while new infrastructure will also be provided. More than 600 desktops will be added to the lab for effective skill training of the enrolled youth over a period of 3 to 4 years. To facilitate skill-based training of more than 7000 youth, the center will provide soft skills training along with hard skills training to ensure overall improvement of the rural youth. Many trades like BFSI, Teacher Training, IT & ITeS (Hardware and Networking), Electronics and Manufacturing will be taught to the students. Each course will be conducted for a duration of 3 to 5 months.

MEANINGFULLY BRIDGING THE EMPLOYMENT GAP | DISTRICTS - DELHI, LUCKNOW, KOLKATA, BENGALURU

To address the employment challenges faced by youth in Delhi, Lucknow, Kolkata, and Bengaluru, NASSCOM Foundation, in collaboration with HDFC Bank Parivartan, is implementing a project designed to bridge the skills gap and enhance job opportunities. Key components include:

- Offering a comprehensive skill development program with 180 hours of training in data analytics, Business Process Management, Banking, Financial Services & Insurance, and Soft Skills.
- Facilitating connections between trainees and potential employers to enhance job placement opportunities.
- Securing placements for trained youth in emerging roles within deep tech and other meaningful job sectors.
- Providing nationally recognized certificates to boost employability and industry recognition.
- Offering post-placement support, including monitoring new hires for six months and assisting with job satisfaction and potential replacements.

This initiative aims to empower 4,520 youth, with a focus on women, by equipping them with the skills needed for meaningful employment and ensuring a successful transition into the workforce.



HEALTHCARE AND HYGIENE

Focused on improving sanitation facilities & promoting safe hygiene practices across several communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

SANITATION FOR ALL | DISTRICTS - GULBARGA, BIDAR, YADGIR

In our ongoing efforts to make sanitation facilities available to all, Parivartan enabled access to hygienic sanitation units for over **495 households** in Karnataka. The programme also focused on community sanitation facilities. Furthermore, Parivartan has paid special attention to creating further awareness in order to bring about a behavioural change in the space of sanitation.

STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

PROMOTING BAMBOO CULTIVATION FOR BETTER FARM INCOMES

LOCATION: CHIKMAGALUR, HASSAN, AND SHIVAMOGGA
BENEFICIARIES: 1200 FARMERS

THE CHALLENGE

The farmers in the project villages of Karnataka were facing low incomes and were dependent on traditional ways of farming.

OUR INTERVENTION

To increase farmer incomes in the target villages, HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with Industree Foundation is encouraging farmers to cultivate bamboo plantations and medicinal plants like Ashwagandha, Palmarosa and Kalmegh. 72000 bamboo saplings and seeds of medical plants and herbs were distributed among 1200 farmers. They were trained on the nurturing and maintenance of these plants. They were also trained on modern farming methods like intercropping to increase their incomes.

THE RESULT

As a result of the intervention, 180 acres of private land across multiple districts has been cultivated with bamboo plants and intercropping has been implemented with herbs like basil, peppermint and ashwagandha. These crops are in high demand and fetch good prices for the farmers in the market.

TAILORING RURAL WOMEN'S SKILL DEVELOPMENT STORIES

LOCATION: VILLAGE CHITALI, KARNATAKA

THE CHALLENGE

Rural women in Village Chitali like Chanamma were hard-pressed for sustenance in absence of any bankable skills for livelihood generation. She was finding it difficult to meet the expenses of her family of eight people including her four children and aged parents-in-law, on the measly income of her husband who worked as an agricultural labourer.

OUR INTERVENTION

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with MYRADA, provided free skill development avenues to women like Chanamma. She was trained in tailoring and sewing at her village's HDFC HRDP tailoring training centre.

THE RESULT

Today, after completing the training programme, Chanamma has received a tailoring machine from HRDP. She stitches clothes at home and earns Rs. 400 to 450 per day as against Rs. 100 to 150 that she was earning before the training. She is able to meet her family's expenses well.



PARIVARTAN HIGHLIGHTS

HDFC BANK EMPLOYEES VISIT OLD-AGE HOME

The employees from the two-wheeler loan department of the HDFC Bank visited Muni Hiraya Nagarika Seva Kendra - an old age home in Bagalkot, Karnataka, and distributed fruits and food items. They shared their time with the elderly at the old-age home. The elderly expressed their gratitude and thanked the HDFC Bank employees for visiting and spending quality time with them.

AWARENESS PROGRAMMES AGAINST TOBACCO CONSUMPTION

Initiating a proactive stance against tobacco consumption, HDFC Bank Parivartan, along side local partner organisations, organised multiple awareness programmes across the state. These sessions were organised on World No Tobacco Day. The programme focused on highlighting the adverse impacts of tobacco usage and the imperative nature of quitting. As part of these efforts, individuals actively committed to ending their tobacco use.

SEED TREATMENT AND CROP MANAGEMENT TRAINING

Seed treatment and crop management training programmes were conducted in the month of June. The first, in Devantagi village, was led by KVK scientists and attended by 68 farmers. The second, in Koilur village, Yadgiri District, focused on seed production, crop management, and pest control. Dr. Umesh Bharikar and Miss Kaveri delivered lectures on selecting healthy seeds, preparing nursery beds, and seed treatment. Emphasising self-sustainability, the programme encouraged farmers to produce seeds like paddy and groundnut locally.

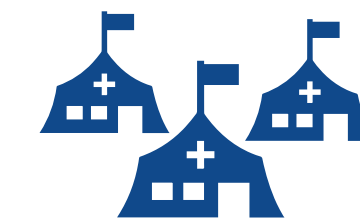

PARIVARTAN AND THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Rural Development

Under Parivartan, the bank has been working in 17+ states in India to bring in holistic development in the rural landscape. It has launched the Holistic Rural Development Programme to address key challenges in rural areas.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

1. Promoting sustainable agriculture through better water management systems by construction of check dams, farm ponds, community ponds and irrigation systems.
2. Empowering farmers through capacity building. Creating Seed Bank, Grain Bank, Village Nursery and supporting field research to achieve food security.

SDG 6 ~ Clean Water and Sanitation

1. Ensuring availability of clean drinking water and promoting sustainable management of water through construction of Rainwater Harvesting Structures, Community Tanks, Hand Pumps and Wells.

SDG7 ~ Affordable and Clean Energy

1. Adopting renewable energy to provide affordable, reliable, sustainable and accessible modern energy through installation of Solar street lights, Biomass Stoves, Community Biogas Plants and Distribution of Solar Home Lights.

Skill Development and Livelihood Enhancement

Administering and enhancing skills is an essential component in increasing employment, ensuring fair share of work and creating sustainable livelihood opportunities. In addition, the bank also focusses on developing livelihood opportunities for women.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

1. HDFC Bank Parivartan has created non-farm based employee opportunities to double farmers' incomes. Using productive resources, farmers are trained on livestock management, thus, benefitting indigenous people, women and villagers.
2. The bank introduced kitchen gardens in villages in several states to promote sustainable agriculture and ensured improved nutrition to the families while successfully ending hunger. It has facilitated creation of over 40,000 kitchen gardens.

SDG4 ~ Quality Education

The bank has facilitated development of dairy cooperatives, poultry farms, integrated poultry-goat rearing-fishery units and other small business to ensure sustained and inclusive growth of the people as well as the region.

1. Through natural farming, formation of seed banks and FPOs, Parivartan has been able to help farmers in innovating their logistics and supply chain, thus enabling sustainable consumption and production patterns.

Promotion of Education

With its special focus in eradicating Non Communicable Diseases in certain states to building accessible sanitation facilities despite challenging terrains, the bank has set an example in the space.
