




MAXIMISING PRODUCTIVITY THROUGH MULTILAYER FARMING | DISTRICT - PATIALA

In order to create sustainable rural communities, its agriculture has to adopt more progressive & effective methods. Parivartan in partnership with Ambuja Cement Foundation - has hence introduced the modern technique of multilayer farming to 4 of its project villages in Punjab. Covering 0.5 acres in each village, the drip irrigation-utilising project encompasses the cultivation of vegetables such as ridge gourd, bitter gourd, pumpkin, tomatoes, chili & brinjal. The initiative is set to bring about the following advantages to its beneficiaries:

- Systemic maximisation of productivity
- Effective utilisation of resources
- Increase in production
- ✓ Water saving







WATER CONSERVATION STRUCTURES CONSTRUCTED



IMPROVED AGRICULTURE WITH WATER-BASED SYSTEMS | DISTRICT - BATHINDA

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with CISSD, has created a water conservation and harvesting structure across 300-acre land, set up drip irrigation system, created ponds for improved crop cultivation, and introduced MANREGA Scheme for employment generation of small landholders in 2 villages in the Bathinda district. Following benefits were derived from the intervention: Improved irrigation and water management for household and agricultural purposes

- Prevent soil erosion, weed growth, reduce cost of cultivation, and faster crop growth
- Improved rainwater harvesting and groundwater recharge
- Enhanced livelihood

Approximately 818 farmers were direct beneficiaries of the intervention, while 4200 farmers were indirect beneficiaries.

ORGANIC FARMING PROMOTION WITH SOLAR PANELS | DISTRICT - BATHINDA

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with CISSD, carried out solar panel installation for the benefit of smallholder and marginal farmer.

Following objectives were accomplished as a result of the intervention:

- Reduce carbon footprint
- Cut down on farming energy consumption
- Promote organic farming
- ✓ Increase in farming income

Approximately 92 farmers were direct beneficiaries of the intervention, while 500-600 farmers were indirect beneficiaries.







REDUCING POLLUTION WITH CROP RESIDUE MANAGEMENT | DISTRICT - PATIALA

HDFC Bank Parivartan has established 14 Farm Machinery Banks in 14 villages with 210 farmers as members to ensure Crop Residue Management (CRM). These banks have been supported with machines like Super Seeder, Rotavator, Zero Till Drill Seed Cum Fertiliser Machine, Disc Harrow, Laser Land Leveler, MB Plough, Potato Planter, Potato Digger, and Multi Crop Planter which have been used by 597 farmers till now, on nominal rent. The total area covered under CRM is 3145 acres in 15 villages through these farm machinery banks. Awareness, demonstration, farmer training on the use of new technology has been a part of the process.

GENERATING SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS FOR RURAL WOMEN & FARMERS | DISTRICTS - LUDHIANA,

RUPNAGAR, MOGA, BARNALA

HDFC Bank Parivartan and Society for Development Alternatives and Grant Thornton Bharat LLP are focusing on local economic activation and envisaging suitable cluster value chain development interventions in both the farm and non - farm sector in 4 districts of Punjab. The intervention will impact 1.62 Lac individuals, specifically marginalised women artisans and farmer stakeholders in the identified districts. 120 Producer Organisations (POs) are being organised through aggregation of smaller institutions like FPOs, SHGs and other informal groups. 120 Input shops and approx. 20 Common Facility Centres (CFCs) are being developed while 480 Business Development Services (BDS) providers are being identified and developed. Major interventions are being undertaken in the Agri - business value chains agriculture and horticulture, dairy, poultry and Goat rearing. The programme entails preparing and implementing a range of business plans, facilitating synergy with a range of service providers, as well as twinning various schemes of the government for sustainable up - scaling and replication of competitiveness and livelihood-oriented interventions.









MITIGATING STUBBLE BURNING | DISTRICT - LUDHIANA Ludhiana. The intervention will focus on:

Setting up biomass pellet & briquette making units Establishing FPOs to host and run profit-making rural enterprises Setting up straw based mechanized composting & bio-gas units Apart from the above, young farmers will be trained to provide advisory support and farm tool machinery will be procured and deployed at 27 farmer co-operatives. 15000 farmers from 126 villages are set to benefit from this intervention that will not just help increase their income but also reduce the problem of stubble burning by 90%.

ENSURING SUSTAINABLE ACCESS TO IMPROVED INFRASTRUCTURE, HEALTH & EDUCATION | DISTRICT - GURDASPUR

HDFC Bank Parivartan and EFRAH - A society for social welfare, under the Holistic Rural Development Programme is working on ensuring sustainable access to health, education, WASH and uplifting infrastructure facilities in the Gurdaspur district of Punjab. The intervention includes: Supporting the marginal farmers to improve their farm product Farmer Interest Group Formation in the Villages to strengthen the farmers Community Establishment of farm machinery bank (Custom Hiring Centres) A Better feed & Fodder Management Practices Improving the learning level of children through engagement with govt. school Creating a child-friendly environment in school for improving enrolment & retention Improving the health condition of the community through regular health check-ups and supporting community-based health institutions Along with combating climate change, the intervention will benefit 16,000+ lives with enhanced socio-economic development.

HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT FOR A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE | DISTRICT - PATIALA

15 villages from the Rajpura block are set to undergo complete transformation with HDFC Bank and Ambuja Cement Foundation's Holistic Rural Development Programme. Along with planting 9000 trees and providing a robust waste management system, the farmers from these target village will experience a boost in their incomes thanks to the natural resource management activities being undertaken. As part of the intervention, 15 government schools will also be transformed into Smart Schools and students here will have access to new improved infrastructure and quality education. Women-led artisan enterprises are being developed where training on weaving, knitting, embroidery, stitching is being provided. Nearly 3550 households can now dream of a sustainable future with income stability and support that can help them achieve their dreams.



The entire north India is facing low air quality due to the problem of stubble burning by farmers. This not just affects the quality of life but also degrades the Agri land to a large extent. To mitigate this issue, HDFC Bank Parivartan along with CII Foundation is promoting sustainable agricultural practices in









HOLISTICALLY TRANSFORMING 15 VILLAGES | DISTRICT - FAZILKA

Fazilka district faces significant challenges with groundwater depletion due to extensive irrigation, soil degradation from paddy stubble burning, and high farming costs impacting livelihoods. Additionally, landless communities, especially women, lack opportunities for sustainable income, and school infrastructure needs significant improvement. A comprehensive three-year project in 15 villages is addressing these issues through key initiatives:

- knitting, and handicrafts.
- education.

Additional efforts include establishing farmer clubs for shared machinery, conducting cattle health camps, demonstrating off-season vegetable cultivation, setting up solid waste management systems, enhancing school infrastructure, and planting 9000 trees to reduce carbon footprint. These holistic initiatives foster community well-being and sustainable development, transforming the lives of Fazilka's residents.

IMPROVING LIVELIHOODS THROUGH NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENTS | DISTRICT - PATHANKOT

Dharkalan and Bamial in Pathankot District are facing soil erosion and water scarcity. To combat the same, Partnering Hope Into Action Foundation (PHIA Foundation) and HDFC Bank Parivartan are implanting a programme that aims to improve the livelihoods of local communities through sustainable practices, biodiversity conservation, and community empowerment. Additionally, initiatives to diversify income sources, such as introducing fruit and millet processing unit are underway. This comprehensive approach not only boosts agricultural productivity and water management but also fosters socio-economic development and climate resilience. This project also includes: Implementing strategies for water storage and rainwater harvesting. Developing micro-irrigation facilities to optimise water use. Introducing solar energy solutions to promote sustainability. Forming and capacitating Village Development Committees (VDCs), Producer Groups, and Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs). \checkmark Ensuring timely availability of quality seeds and seedlings. Promoting sustainable practices such as farmyard manure (FYM), vermicomposting, bio fertilisers and integrated pest management. By integrating these activities, this project aims to empower rural communities, enhance livelihoods, and promote sustainable development through a holistic approach.



A Water Management: Implementing micro irrigation and soil moisture conservation techniques to combat groundwater depletion.

A Stubble Burning Management: Promoting in-situ practices to enhance soil health and crop yield while reducing environmental damage.

Farm Productivity: Training farmers in improved crop practices and collective actions to lower cultivation costs and secure better crop prices. A Livelihood Enhancement: Empowering landless women farmers by organising artisan groups and providing market-driven skill training in stitching,

IMPROVING EDUCATION THROUGH SMART

CLASSES | DISTRICTS - SANGRUR, PATIALA, AMRITSAR In partnership with Ambuja Cement Foundation, Parivartan launched Smart Classes in 6 of its project villages: Ramsara, Wahab Wala, Narayanpura, Balluana, Mahuana Bodla & Tahliwala Jattan. In order to kindle the curiosity of students through the provision of affordable quality education, these classes focus on multimedia e-learning methods such as animations (both 2D & 3D), presentations, conferences & many others. Some of its objectives include:

- Improving student-teacher interactions
- Improving creativity
- Enabling a better understanding of concepts
- Allowing students to learn at their own pace
- Providing a better learning experience

These digital classrooms come with projectors preloaded with curriculum-based content & interactive boards that make learning fun. Also covering 3 other districts in Punjab - namely Sangrur, Patiala & Amritsar - the initiative also focuses on training teachers in order that they can better utilise these facilities. As a result of Smart Classes, students have been found to be more interested in educating themselves - thus ensuring them a better future.

ROBUST EDUCATION FACILITIES WITH THE HELP OF SMART SCHOOLS | DISTRICT - LUDHIANA

To provide robust education facilities to students and better support structure to teachers by strengthening and upgradation the infrastructure of government schools, HDFC Bank Parivartan in association with Society for Action in Community Health is upgrading 20 primary and middle government schools in Ludhiana to Smart schools. The upgradation will directly impact 8244 students and teachers in Ludhiana, resulting in a reduction in drop-out rates of students. The attendance rates of students will improve and quality of education will be uplifted resulting in better morale in students, teachers and parents.

DEVELOPING FOUNDATIONAL LEARNING AND NUMERACY COMPETENCIES IN GOVT SCHOOL STUDENTS | DISTRICTS - JAISHANKER BHUPALPALLY, VIRUDHUNAGAR, AMRITSAR, BAKSA, KALAHANDI

To improve learning levels of primary class students in targeted government schools, HDFC Bank Parivartan worked with Central Square Foundation and promoted the Foundation, Learning and Numeracy (FLN) Mission, under which it supports Government of Punjab, to plan and implement the Padho Punjab, Padhao Punjab (PPPP) programme through a project management unit (PMU). The programme aims to ensure that every school going child achieves basic competencies of reading with comprehension and foundational mathematics. With strategic support, PPPP intends to transform the lives of 6,76,362 children in primary grades by enabling them to achieve FLN skills by 2026 27. The program aims to achieve this goal by building FLN capacity of 44,126 Primary grade teachers across 13,197 government schools in the state.


MOGA, RUPNAGAR

HDFC Bank Parivartan in association with Indo Global Social Service Society is working on transforming 40 Government Schools spread over 10 districts of Punjab. Each of these government schools will be provided with one SMART Class each. This will result in improved morale and increased attendance in schools.

STRENGTHENING EDUCATIONAL & MEDICAL INFRASTRUCTURE | DISTRICTS - BHATINDA, LUDHIANA, TARN TARAN, MANSA, AMRITSAR HDFC Bank Parivartan along with Society for Action in Community Health is working on developing the educational and medical infrastructure that will positively impact 7500 individuals from 5 districts of Punjab. Government school in the region will see improved digital infrastructure and will be converted into smart school. ICT Labs, music rooms, libraries and science labs will be refurbished and provided with new equipment. Transportation facility will also be made available. Additionally, 1 hospital will be equipped with state-of-the-art facilities which will help in safe and improved diagnosis.






EMPLOYMENT GENERATION THROUGH MODEL LIVESTOCK | DISTRICT - BATHINDA HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with CISSD, has provided 1 goat-rearing unit (6 female + 1 male goat) to 20 SHGs of small landholders and landless farmers. The following objectives were the part of the intervention: Employment generation for marginal farmers Providing technical training for construction and maintenance of sheds and managing expenses. Approximately 203 SHG members were direct beneficiaries of the intervention, while 1100-2000 SHG were indirect beneficiaries. The intervention will generate sustainable income source and encourage entrepreneurship within the local community.

STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

FROM ADVERSITY TO EMPOWERMENT

LOCATION: MOHALI BENEFICIARY: VISHANT

THE CHALLENGE

Vishant, a 22-year-old boy from Mohali, faced financial constraints and limited means to pursue further studies after completing his graduation and had no means to pursue further studies. His father, in a private job with a meagre income, was struggling hard to meet the family's daily needs and was in constant pressure.

OUR INTERVENTION

Vishant enrolled himself in the Banking Accounting Executive Course by HDFC Bank Parivartan in collaboration with Orion Educational Society. The vocational training was aimed to equip marginalized aspirants like Vishant with skills with valuable insights into the dynamic world of banking. He successfully completed the course in 3 months, gaining new skills and industry readiness in the financial sector.

THE RESULT

Vishant successfully secured a job as a Virtual Care officer at HDFC Bank Mohali, with a monthly salary of 17,333/-. The rigorous training prepared him for industry standards, enabling him to learn and match expectations from the bank. Mentoring by Orion Mohali trainers and support during the course aided Vishant's growth and job preparation.





STORIES OF PARIVARTAN

HOMEMAKER TO COMMUNITY-MAKER

LOCATION: MOHI KALAN BENEFICIARY: PRAKASH KAUR

THE CHALLENGE

Prakash Kaur is an homemaker and hails from a community where its considered unconventional for women to step out of their houses to earn their livelihood. She and other women of the family depend on the male earning members for financial security. Kaur's husband is unemployed and that added to her woes.

OUR INTERVENTION

HDFC Bank Parivartan along with Ambuja Cement Foundation aided Kaur along with other members of the Noor Artisan Self Help Group with skill training in stitching, knitting, weaving, embroidery and bought them sewing machines. The organisation convinced Kaur's family members that if women come together, they can make a huge difference in the society.

THE RESULT

Prakash Kaur is now skilled to stitch all kinds of garments and is making Rs. 4,500 per month. This has not just enabled her to contribute to her family's income, but has also developed confidence in her. She is now a role model for many young women in her community.









ESCALATING AIR POLLUTION LEVELS HAVE TURNED THE SPOTLIGHT, ONCE AGAIN, ON STUBBLE BURNING IN PUNJAB.

To mitigate stubble burning, HDFC Bank and CII Foundation have launched a crop residue management project in Ludhiana District in Punjab. Ms. Manjeet Kaur, SDM, Jagraon, Mr. Narinder Singh Benipal, Chief Agriculture Officer, Mr. Deepak Sharma Co-operative Inspector, Mr. Jatinder Kumar, Cluster Head, Jagraon, Mr. Sailesh Verma, Branch Manager, HDFC Bank and farmers in large numbers attended a farmer outreach event organised at Jagraon, Ludhiana on 6th and 7th November.

Under this project, farmers will be supported with appropriate machinery and technical know-how to adopt environment-friendly agricultural practices.





TREE PLANTATION DRIVE HELD WITH LOCAL NGOS TO MARK INDEPENDENCE DAY

HDFC Bank Parivartan teamed up with BSF Attari Amritsar to plant 11600 trees thereby creating a mini forest at BSF Headquarters, Amritsar. The objective was to have a 'respiratory system' which will be the epicentre of oxygen generation amid rich flora and fauna. Similarly, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Oxfam India joined hands to conduct a Swachh Bharat Mission programme at Manikera and Banjamunda aligned with the theme, 'Clean village and Green village'. The initiative held on the account of Independence Day involved the cleaning of schools and surrounding village areas, a tree plantation drive in Manikera APC office and Banjamunda, and a hand wash programme to underline the importance of health and hygiene.




ZIIEI, one of our largest programmes is in its third phase, focusing improving learning outcomes in more than 10,000 schools across India integrating the concepts of 'Project Based Learning'. 
- Covers 31 states/UTs

- Organised 28 sessions across 6 states in FY 2023-24

















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SKILL TRAINING AND LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT



PARIVARTAN AND THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Rural Development

Under Parivartan, the bank has been working in 17+ states in India to bring in holistic development in the rural landscape. It has launched the Holistic Rural Development Programme to address key challenges in rural areas.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

1. Promoting sustainable agriculture through better water management systems by construction of check dams, farm ponds, community ponds and irrigation systems.

2. Empowering farmers through capacity building. Creating Seed Bank, Grain Bank, Village Nursery and supporting field research to achieve food security.

SDG 6 ~ Clean Water and Sanitation

1. Ensuring availability of clean drinking water and promoting sustainable management of water through construction of Rainwater Harvesting Structures, Community Tanks, Hand Pumps and Wells.

SDG7 ~ Affordable and Clean Energy

1. Adopting renewable energy to provide affordable, reliable, sustainable and accessible modern energy through installation of Solar street lights, Biomass Stoves, Community Biogas Plants and Distribution of Solar Home Lights.





Skill Development and Livelihood Enhancement

Administering and enhancing skills is an essential component in increasing employment, ensuring fair share of work and creating sustainable livelihood opportunities. In addition, the bank also focusses on developing livelihood opportunities for women.

SDG 2 ~ Zero Hunger

1. HDFC Bank Parivartan has created non-farm based employee opportunities to double farmers' incomes. Using productive resources, farmers are trained on livestock management, thus, benefitting indigenous people, women and villagers.

2. The bank introduced kitchen gardens in villages in several states to promote sustainable agriculture and ensured improved nutrition to the families while successfully ending hunger. It has facilitated creation of over 40,000 kitchen gardens.

SDG4 ~ Quality Education

1. Under Parivartan, the bank is working to provide access to affordable, technical and vocational education. The bank has trained over 1.60 lakh individuals under its Skill Development programme keeping with principles of equity and inclusivity.

SDG5 ~ Gender Equality

1. Parivartan has formed/revived over 7,500 SHGs with an aim to empower women in rural India. The initiative has strengthened the cause of achieving gender equality by enabling the women to achieve better livelihood opportunities.

1. The bank has trained over 1.04 lakh farmers through exposure visits and diverse agricultural training programmes for their sustained economic growth. Through varied capacity building initiatives, the farmers are able to seek full and productive employment.

2. Parivartan has empowered farmers through entrepreneurial programmes through financial as well as skill-based support. The bank has facilitated development of dairy cooperatives, poultry farms, integrated poultry-goat rearing-fishery units and other small business to ensure sustained and inclusive growth of the people as well as the region.

















SDG12 ~ Responsible Consumption and Production

1. Through natural farming, formation of seed banks and FPOs, Parivartan has been able to help farmers in innovating their logistics and supply chain, thus enabling sustainable consumption and production patterns.

Promotion of Education

This is one of the most important pillars of Parivartan that promotes equal education to all from early childhood to secondary education. The initiative also advocates usage of technology through digitisation of schools and introducing science labs to encourage the scientific temper of children.

1. To further improve the access to inclusive and equitable quality education, the bank has undertaken several initiatives including remedial classes, learning camps, training the teachers and by offering scholarships. The bank has also created requisite infrastructure for students from underprivileged background to access education in a safe and lively environment.

1. Parivartan has included sports as one of the fundamentals of education to ensure healthy lives of children while promoting their well-being. The bank has facilitated training of hockey, football and other sports while also ensuring access to the requisite sports equipment.

Healthcare and Hygiene

Our bank has actively worked towards providing better healthcare and sanitation facilities to the vulnerable communities. With its special focus in eradicating Non Communicable Diseases in certain states to building accessible sanitation facilities despite challenging terrains, the bank has set an example in the space.


SDG8 ~ Decent Work and Economic Growth
