

KEY INTERVENTIONS





DISTRICT - SOUTH SIKKIM

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with Gramin Vikas Trust, is enabling holistic development in South Sikkim through the HRDP initiative. By promoting nutritious crops, supporting duck rearing, enhancing education through smart schools and anganwadi upgrades, and introducing solar lighting, the programme is creating sustainable livelihood opportunities. Farmers receive modern tools, livestock training, and financial literacy, while artisans are supported to preserve traditional crafts. Natural resource efforts like bamboo plantations help prevent landslides. With an integrated approach, the initiative is gently uplifting rural communities—ensuring well-being, resilience, and inclusive progress.

STRENGTHENING RURAL FUTURES IN THE EASTERN **HIMALAYAS**

| DISTRICT - PAKYONG

To address income challenges caused by small landholdings and erratic rainfall, HDFC Bank Parivartan and The Citizens Foundation launched a Rural Development initiative in 19 villages across the Eastern Himalayas. Focused on tribal and marginalised families, the project promotes sustainable agriculture, livelihood training, education, healthcare, and clean energy. Community institutions like SHGs, FPOs, and VDCs are being revived to foster ownership and growth. With school upgrades, tree plantations, solar lighting, sanitary pad vending machines, and even better sports facilities, the initiative brings communities together - building resilience and gently nurturing long-term, inclusive development.

UPLIFTING THE RURAL POPULATION

DISTRICT - GYALSHING

In 15 villages of the district, HDFC Bank Parivartan and People To People Health Foundation are uplifting over 13,000 lives through a comprehensive rural development initiative. From improving clean water, sanitation, and healthcare to upgrading schools and skill centres, the programme promotes long-term well-being. By supporting apple orchards, millet and bamboo farming, fish and poultry rearing, and women-led enterprises, the project enables livelihood diversification. Solar-powered water systems, rainwater harvesting, and artisan markets enhance resilience. Most importantly, strong community institutions are being nurtured—ensuring local voices lead the journey toward sustainable change.

BUILDING SUSTAINABLE RURAL FUTURES

HDFC Bank Parivartan and Gramin Vikas Trust are revolutionising rural livelihoods with their Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP). Key initiatives include introducing nutrient-rich crops like buckwheat and millet, supporting farmers with tools and training, and encouraging duck farming as a steady income source. The programme also uplifts artisans by enhancing skills and cultural heritage, renovates anganwadis, and establishes smart schools for better education. Additionally, bamboo plantations and resource management practices promote environmental sustainability. By integrating these efforts, HRDP improves safety, productivity, and quality of life, creating lasting change for rural communities.

THE CHALLENGE

In the quiet hills of rural Sikkim, many Anganwadi Centres had been serving communities for years, but their infrastructure gradually required attention and renewal. Limited play areas, ageing facilities, and a need for improved sanitation highlighted the importance of creating safer and more engaging spaces for children. To ensure that early learning environments remain welcoming and supportive, efforts were needed to strengthen these centres and restore the joy of learning.

OUR INTERVENTION

Under the Holistic Rural Development Programme, HDFC Bank Parivartan and partners stepped in to reignite joy. With support from the community and local departments, six centres were transformed with:

- Hygienic kitchens for safe meal preparation
- Bright, tiled floors and clean, child-friendly toilets
- · Colourful murals and vibrant classrooms
- Safe fencing and secure play areas

THE RESULT

The transformation was more than physical—it touched hearts. Children now walk into cheerful, secure spaces that spark curiosity. Attendance has risen, and communities feel a renewed trust in early education. For many children, it's their first step into a brighter, more nurturing future.
