TRANSFORMING EARLY LEARNING | DISTRICT - WEST TRIPURA

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with SUVIDHA, is enhancing childhood development in 150 ICDS centers across the region through creative and interactive learning. The initiative includes BaLa Painting for creativity, improved seating for comfort, and smart TVs for digital learning. Over 150+ centers are being renovated, 200+ smart TVs installed, and sports materials provided to enrich learning for 20,000+ children. Community engagement efforts further ensure long-term impact, benefiting over 5,000 families.

FROM MARGINS TO MILESTONES | STATES - MEGHALAYA, TRIPURA

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in partnership with Ad Station, is driving a holistic development project across East Jaintia Hills (Meghalaya) and West Tripura, impacting 25,711 individuals and 5,345 households. The initiative empowers marginalised communities through skill training for 190 youths and women, promotion of 26 community enterprises (22 women-led), and livelihood diversification via cash crops, organic farming, and bamboo-based enterprises. It enhances education with six smart schools and 12 renovated Anganwadi centres, and strengthens 15 community institutions. With solar-powered village solutions, upgraded healthcare, sanitation facilities, and local tourism support, the project advances income, education, health, sustainability, and community resilience.

TURNING DREAMS INTO LIVELIHOODS: THE DUCK REARING JOURNEY

THE CHALLENGE


For over a decade, the women of Twima Bodol SHG worked hard to sustain their families through savings and small loans. Yet, the dream of running a self-sustaining enterprise remained out of reach. With limited livelihood options and underused local resources, hope often felt distant.

OUR INTERVENTION

Through HDFC Bank Parivartan's Focussed Development Programme, implemented by Tomorrow's Foundation, a duck rearing unit was established using a community-owned pond. The project included building a duck shed, securing fencing, providing 50 ducklings, feed, vaccines, and expert guidance—all made possible through the collective will of the SHG and support from the Village Development Committee.

THE RESULT

In just one month, the unit came to life. With 32 female ducks laying eggs daily, the group expects to earn Rs.10,000/month, creating a dependable income source. More importantly, it brought a renewed sense of pride, ownership, and belief among the women. The initiative has inspired the wider community, with local leaders pledging to expand the model to other SHGs—proving that when dreams are supported with action, real change begins.
