

Promoting holistic rural development of communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

IMPROVING IRRIGATION TO INCREASE INCOME | DISTRICT - GORAKHPUR, BAHRAICH, PRAYAGRAJ, PRATAPGARH, AYODHYA, SHRAVASTI, BARABANKI, SITAPUR, LALITPUR, CHITRAKOOT, JHANSI In Uttar Pradesh, farm lands are mostly dependent on rain for irrigation. Due to the unavailability of good irrigation facilities farmers were forced to restrict themselves to paddy and wheat cultivation. HDFC Bank Parivartan along with different partner organisations with an aim to aid, installed more than 100 units of solar based group irrigation units in different villages of project imterventions districts. After the intervention, 5400+ farmers now have access to irrigation facilities and are therefore able to cultivate other crops. Additionally, this has also reduced irrigation expenses that farmers previously incurred and increased their income levels.



HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT IN 15 VILLAGES | DISTRICT - AYODHYA

HDFC Bank Parivartan has initiated a programme to mitigate low income among farmers, low standard of living, poor health services, lack of infrastructure and lack of educational institutions among 15 villages of Ayodhya.

The proposed intervention includes:

- ✓ Increase in farmers' income.
- ✓ Improvement in standard of living.
- Improvement in health services among marginalised sections.
- ✓ Improvement in infrastructure and learning facilities including quality of education.
- ✓ Socio-economic empowerment of women through community based institutions such as Village Development Committee (VDC).
- Encouraging financial inclusion.
- ✓ Micro-enterprise development.
- ✓ Establishing Village Resource Centres (VRCs).

Ushering in a new age for the people, the project has enhanced livelihood; improved healthcare, water and sanitation services; developed educational infrastructure; managed natural resources and encouraged financial inclusion.

HARNESSING THE SUN FOR SUSTAINABILITY | DISTRICT - CHANDAULI

According to a recent announcement by the Indian government, the country has managed to achieve 100% electrification in its rural areas. However, this figure is limited solely to the provision of infrastructure such as generators and the electrification of public spaces such as schools and panchayats. More importantly, this statistic also fails to take into account the fact that the source of this electrification is non-renewable and thus unsustainable in the long run. Under its Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP), the bank and Sahbhagi Shiksha Kendra have hence installed 100 solar-powered street lights in 10 different villages in the district of treet lamps have also had a significant positive uring safety and allowing school-going children











PROMOTING SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE WITH SOLAR IRRIGATION | DISTRICT - SHRAVASTI

HDFC Bank Parivartan, with the aid of GEAG supported smallholder farmers of Shravasti district. The objective of the intervention was to promote renewable energy sources, through deployment of solar irrigation pumps for agriculture. Previously farmers were always worried about cultivating crops in rabi and zaid seasons due to crop failure, the crop intensity has now increased in both seasons. The intervention has helped cut down input cost by almost 10x.

EMPOWERING RURAL COMMUNITIES THROUGH FLORICULTURE AND ORCHARD DEVELOPMENT | DISTRICT – SITAPUR, VARANASI, JHANSI, CHITRAKOOT & SAHARANPUR To encourage small farmers to earn better incomes from their farms, Parivartan, in association with the Aga Khan Foundation (India), Ambuja Cement foundation and CARD launched an intervention to train and upskill farmers in farming best practices and alternative farming techniques. A total of 30 beneficiaries have benefitted through floriculture in district Sitapur. In Varanasi, total of 75 beneficiaries benefit through the floriculture. At Saharanpur, Jhansi and Chitrakoot district, 240 nano-orchards are developed for different farmers which are resulting in high profits for the beneficiaries.

TRANSFORMING LIVES THROUGH FISH FARMING | DISTRICT - BAHRAICH

To encourage alternative means of income for small farmers, Parivartan in association with Aga Khan Foundation (India) launched an intervention under HRDP with the objective of promoting fish farming among farmers in project villages. A notable case among them is that of Taiyyab Khan, a 70 year old farmer from Bankuri Village who has a 5 acre farm and 0.14 acre pond. He was trained on best practices on fish farming and provided with fish feed. Taiyyab implemented his learnings and shifted to cultivating Gross, Rohu, Naini and silver breeds instead of catfish that he was cultivating earlier. He harvested 430 kg of fish and fetched Rs. 57,000/- on selling 380 kg of the produce. He made a profit of Rs. 13,000/- on the single harvest. Initially, 17 farmers were covered under the intervention, impacting 187 people in all. Collectively more than 2000 kg of fish was harvested by the 17 beneficiary fish farmers with a collective income of Rs 2.38 lacs. The beneficiary families also consumed more fish leading to a marked increase in their nutritional diversity and overall well being.









SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT | DISTRICT - MAHOBA

For a complete socio-economic improvement in 50 villages of the Jaitpur block, HDFC Bank along with Self Reliant Initiatives through Joint Action (SRIJAN) is working on holistic development initiatives. This includes:

- Constructing & renovating dams & wells
- Establishing prakritik kendras & seed banks
- ✓ Installing 500 solar street lights
- ✓ Developing nano orchards & gabion structures
- ✓ Forming 50 VDCs & 100 farmer groups

The overall objective of the intervention is to strengthen farmer livelihoods by sustainably managing natural resources. Over 2500 farmers will see the impact with an increase in their incomes by 25% to 30%.



Millets have been grown in India since centuries. To promote this legacy of a staple Indian diet and to provide the small and marginalised farmers with better livelihoods, HDFC Bank Parivartan is working closely with Aga Khan Foundation. More than 4500 farmers across 60 villages in target areas will see an increase in their incomes through chemical free farming techniques and adoption of millet farming. They will be provided with fencing systems to protect their crops against strays. Farmer collectives will ensure the setting up of farmer Field Schools and seed banks. Custom hiring centres and bio input centres will be set up in these villages.

MODERNISING AGRICULTURE FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS | DISTRICT - BALRAMPUR

Marginalised and small farmers from many districts of our states often do not get access to environmentally sustainable practices that are launched from time to time. To address this problem, HDFC Bank Parivartan has joined hands with Peoples Action for National Integration to bring sustainable modern agricultural practices especially in the area of water conservation and climate-smart crop diversification. Sprinkler irrigation, vermicomposting and potato mechanisation will be introduced to the farmers. Many community institutions are being encouraged. The land under cultivation and irrigation will be increased that this will enable farmers to generate viable livelihoods.









CLIMATE FRIENDLY LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT OF RURAL POPULATIONS | DISTRICT - SONBHADRA

To improve the overall quality of life in villages, it is important to bring about sustainable increase in farmer incomes. HDFC Bank Parivartan in association with BAIF Institute for Sustainable Livelihoods and Development is working on creating the infrastructure for community institutions that will fuel rural incomes. Area under farming will be increased and a great stress will be laid on promoting chemical-free farming. Additionally, area under irrigation will be increased and 30 solar irrigation pumps will be provided to farmers to reduce their dependence on rains. The intervention also aims at providing alternate household income by developing 150 fruit orchards. These interventions are poised to bring increased incomes to nearly 2500 farmers.

BUILDING FARMER FRIENDLY RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE | DISTRICT - BANDA

A robust rural infrastructure will ensure an economically prosperous rural population. With this objective, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Manjari Foundation are working together on bringing a package of initiatives to build community institutions, increase area under irrigation and cultivation while reducing carbon footprint and increasing rural incomes. The key deliverables will be setting up of polly houses, solar water pumps, street lights, sprinkler sets and farmer producer groups. Traditional water bodies will also be restored along with restoring damaged structures with the help of the community. Check dams will be constructed and existing ponds will be desilted. Multiple custom hiring centres will be established. Farmers will be able to diversify their incomes with the introduction of nano orchards and multi-layered farming. More than 24000 people will directly benefit from these activities.

FOSTERING IMPROVED EDUCATION AND LIFESTYLE | DISTRICT - SIDDHARTHNAGAR

HDFC Bank Parivartan and Aroh Foundation are working together and implementing several initiatives to upgrade the lives of small, marginalised farmers and underprivileged rural families in 15 target villages. The interventions include promotion of safe living conditions, improvement in sanitation, healthcare, providing safe drinking water facilities and hygiene infrastructure. The interventions will also improve the infrastructure at anganwadis and 15 government schools will be upgraded into SMART schools. In addition, the following activities are also being undertaken:

- ✓ 300 acres of land will be cultivated using chemical-free farming practices
- ✓ 410 acres of land will have new irrigation cover.
- ★ 80 acres of uncultivated land will be brought under vegetation.

The income of more than 1200 farmers will increase with these initiatives. Apart from this, solar irrigation pumps will be provided to reduce carbon foot-prints in villages and 5 villages will have access to clean drinking water facilities. The intervention will impact more than 28000 people from 4100 households.





TRANSFORMING RURAL COMMUNITIES IN AGRA | DISTRICT - AGRA

In a bid to address agricultural, health, and educational challenges, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Ambuja Cement Foundation are driving a comprehensive transformation in 15 villages of Fatehabad block. This initiative focuses on improving the lives of over 4,000 households and nearly 29,000 individuals through the following interventions:

- ✓ Establishing 15 farmer clubs and setting up 15 farm machinery banks
- Conducting monthly health camps, including 60 health check-up camps, and providing cattle vaccinations
- → Reviving 60 self-help groups with capacity-building training for women
- → Renovating water tanks and ponds and installing nine solar-operated drinking water stations
- ✓ Upgrading 410 schools to SMART schools with modern amenities
 The project aims to foster sustainable development and significantly enhance the quality of life in these rural areas.

SUSTAINING RURAL LIVELIHOODS IN LALITPUR | DISTRICT - LALITPUR

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in collaboration with Centre for Advanced Research and Development (CARD), is implementing a comprehensive programme to enhance agricultural practices and environmental sustainability across 40 villages in Madawra Block. Key initiatives include:

- ✓ Establishing 40 Village Development Committees (VDCs) and 80 Farmers Groups (FIGs)
- → Renovating 29 wells, constructing 14 check dams, and implementing water harvesting structures
- Introducing modern irrigation techniques and multilayer farming practices
- ✓ Installing 400 solar street lights and promoting tree plantations

This project aims to bolster community resilience, improve agricultural productivity, and promote environmental stewardship.

Creating a conducive learning environment in communities

DIGITISING EDUCATION | DISTRICTS - SITAPUR, LAKHIMPUR, KUSHINAGAR, DEORIA, GORAKHPUR, VARANASI, AGRA, MATHURA, LALITPUR, BULANDSHAHAR, SHRAVASTI, KAUSHAMBI, BARABANKI, SAHARANPUR, AYODHYA, CHANDAULI

Education has undergone a sea change during the past few decades, opening up new avenues for innovation & technology in the sector. While our country continues to adapt to these new changes, there are still sections that are unable to keep up. HDFC Bank's Parivartan aspires to create a level playing field by making technology accessible. The Bank has hence installed smart classrooms in 200 Government schools across Uttar Pradesh to allow students from socio-economically marginalised backgrounds access best education. Besides making the classes more vibrant & student-friendly, the digital classroom initiative has also helped in instilling confidence in students: reflected in an observed increase in engagement levels. The classrooms consist of requisite digital infrastructure, including projectors preloaded with curriculum-based content & interactive boards that make learning fun.

SETTING UP MINI SCIENCE LABS IN SCHOOLS | DISTRICT - AYODHYA, SITAPUR, MATHURA, BULANDSHAHAR

To make it easy for children to learn science & maths, Parivartan has enabled the setting up of 125 Mini Science Labs in schools across Uttar Pradesh. These labs serve as an interactive platform for students to gain insightful knowledge about mathematical & scientific concepts. Well-designed boards & easy-to-use plug & play models make learning experience fun for the students. It comes as an additional benefit for the teachers as their students understand the subject better. This programme offers hands-on experience, encourages curiosity & develops interest among the children, thus furthering their chances to perform well academically.

BETTER INFRASTRUCTURE FOR A BETTER FUTURE | DISTRICT - CHANDAULI

Like most of rural India, the district of Chandauli is home to a number of government schools with very poor infrastructure. A vast majority of students are forced to sit on floor mats whilst teachers find it quite challenging to do their job effectively due to the difficulties they face in maintaining decorum. Parivartan's Holistic Rural Development Programme (HRDP) categorically focuses on the educational needs of such schools. In partnership with the government's Samagra Siksha Kendra (SSK), the Bank has hence supported 11 schools in the district through the provision of desks and benches. As a result, these schools have reported an overall increase in attendance as well as the creation of a classroom ambiance conducive to learning.

UPGRADING SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE | DISTRICT - VARANASI, PRAYAGRAJ, CHANDAULI, GHAZIPUR, GORAKHPUR

Effective learning spaces consider three dimensions to support the holistic development of a child: pedagogical, environmental and digital. To enhance the infrastructure at 100 schools in Uttar Pradesh, HDFC Bank Parivartan ang Learning Links Foundation are focused at converting them into Smart Schools. The intervention also aims at setting up libraries, science labs and improving sanitation facilities to support hygiene and cleanliness. The project aims to motivate the teachers, SMC members, parents and other government stakeholders to adopt the precise practices of documentation, use of new pedagogy based on learning by doing concept, adoption of new technology and ensuring involvement of students while promoting smart school concept. Training of all stakeholders will ensure creation of an enabling environment for continuous development of students.









STUDENT LEARNING IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The 'Student Learning Improvement Program' with Khan Academy India is being implemented across UP Govt. schools and Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs) across the country to improve math learning outcomes with a primary focus on students from 6th to 12th standards. It entails strengthening of the learning levels and educational quality, fostering a culture of excellence and innovation in math education. Teachers are being better equipped to support their students, while students are benefiting from engaging, personalized learning experiences. As more students participate in daily math practice, the overall quality of math education in the region is set to improve. The project has reached out to more than 65,000 students across 700+ govt. schools in UP. The UP Govt. along recently announced expansion in its support to Khan Academy to cover nearly 500,000 students in the state. The project, in its 3rd year now, will be able to expand as well in its overall project period in the UP accordingly.

ENHANCING EDUCATIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE IN MAU | DISTRICT - MAU

To address inadequate educational infrastructure, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Ambuja Cement Foundation are upgrading a government school in the Mau district. This project focuses on:

- Upgrading infrastructure for approximately 500 students and teachers
- → Providing essential furniture and training teachers in effective educational practices
- ✓ Introducing innovative pedagogical methods and integrating technology in teaching
- ✓ Implementing monitoring mechanisms for attendance, health services, and academic assessments

The initiative aims to improve learning outcomes, increase student engagement, and foster holistic development in the community.









SKILL TRAINING AND LIVELIHOOD ENHANCEMENT

Upskilling individuals to enable sustainable income generation

KEY INTERVENTIONS

BIO INPUT CENTRE | DISTRICT - LAKHIMPUR

In the Nakaha block of Lakhimpur, the Aga Khan Foundation, with the support of HDFC Bank CSR, successfully established a Bio-Input Resource Centre (BRC). This center produced and marketed three essential bio-inputs: Cow Pat Pit (CPP) known as Mrida Sanjivani, Poudh Vardhak, and Poudh Rakshak. The primary objective was to raise awareness about these bio-input products and stimulate demand through campaigns like "Unnat Kheti Ke Sunhere Products" and "Unnat Kheti Ki Pradarshini: आइये, समझिय, खरीदे." Conducting meetings under the guidance of community organizers and lead farmers from the Farmer Field School (FFS), the BRC members took charge of marketing the products in Nakaha Block. The distribution network expanded to include agri-input shops in Lakhimpur, with plans to cater to the bio-input needs of approximately 1200 farmers in 30 neighboring villages.

SKILLING THE SPECIALLY ABLED | DISTRICT - VARANASI

Parivartan in partnership with Sarthak education trust, is working towards upskilling specially abled individuals by providing training in trades like computer, ITes, customer service, retail, e-commerce, pharmacy, mobile repair, IT etc. The project aims to provide skill development training and sustainable employment opportunity to persons with disabilities. Till now total of 577 PwD are trained from which 390 have been placed. Currently, 66 trainees are undergoing skill training.





IMPACT IN UTTAR PRADESH









UPSKILLING THE FUTURE | DISTRICT - LUCKNOW, NOIDA

Parivartan and Ambuja Cement Foundation designed a project to reach the unprivileged and economically marginalised population in Lucknow and Noida with skill training and placement support initiatives. The training courses identified for the Skill Development Center were:

- General Duty Assistant
- ✓ Medical Lab Technician
- ✓ Field Technician AC
- Retail Management

The project will be able to train 3370 aspirants of which 70% will be placed. The HDFC Bank Skill Development project is expected to have high social returns which is attainable because of the Bank's continuous placement, retention and career progression efforts.

FROM LANDLESSNESS TO PROSPERITY | DISTRICT - AYODHA

Seeking a substantial & stable means of livelihood is a grave challenge for many living below the poverty line in Uttar Pradesh. To break this chain of despair, Parivartan introduced a 3-tier Livelihood structure in Ayodhya. The innovative model focused on making the landless or the economically marginal gain an entrepreneurial outlook & earn their livelihood through poultry, goat & fish rearing – all at once. They were also specially designed to house goats, hens & fish on separate floors in the mentioned order, thus allowing the usage of minimal resources in raising & nurturing these animals. The target families were also trained in organic composting & developing vegetable gardens to diversify their opportunities. Once fully developed, it has the potential to sustain itself for over 30 years & generate a monthly income of about Rs. 9,000-10,000. The Bank, along with its implementation partner, is also working towards getting the model replicated by the State Rural Livelihood Mission to benefit even more vulnerable & marginalised families.

GENERATING LIVELIHOOD OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH SKILL BASED TRAINING | DISTRICT - LONI, BHANGEL, BADARPUR

As we rapidly make progress in several areas, many communities need special attention and upliftment to be a true beneficiary of India's growth story. HDFC Bank Parivartan and Udayan Care are partnering on providing skills-based training to 420 marginalised youth from Delhi and UP with at least 50% female representation. They will be trained on IT applications, digital media, soft skills, English language and other vocational courses to create long-term career growth. The intervention will provide livelihood enhancement for the participants along with their families as it aims to provide job placements to 80% of the participants, placement assistance will also be provided to the students through corporate engagement.

ECONOMIC GROWTH BACKED BY SKILL DEVELOPMENT | DISTRICT - AGRA

As India takes giant leaps as a growing economy in the modern world, many sectors provide opportunities for employment to our youth. HDFC Bank Parivartan in partnership with Centum Foundation will train and certify 3000 youth in employable skills from sunshine sectors like banking, retail, healthcare, tourism and hospitality, based on their interests. An estimated 2250 of them will be provided with job placements. This initiative will greatly empower the youth and inspire many others to come forward and seek upskilling in the future.





BRIDGING THE SKILL GAP FOR YOUTH IN UTTAR PRADESH | DISTRICTS - LUCKNOW, VARANASI

In response to the skills shortage exacerbated by the COVID-19 economic downturn, HDFC Bank Parivartan and Ambuja Cement Foundation are launching a targeted programme to support skill development and employment for 3,305 youths in Uttar Pradesh. Key actions include:

- → Providing 180 hours of training in various trades and offering intensive career counselling.
- → Aiming to place 2,086 youths in sustainable employment
- Specialised training for women to promote gender equality
- Offering ongoing mentoring and support for career progression

This initiative addresses immediate job needs and aims to lay a foundation for long-term socio-economic empowerment in the region.









HEALTHCARE AND HYGIENE

Focused on improving sanitation facilities & promoting safe hygiene practices across several communities

KEY INTERVENTIONS

SANITATION FOR ALL | DISTRICT – VARANASI, CHANDAULI, SHRAVASTI, LALITPUR, SAHARANPUR, PRATAPGARH, PRAYAGRAJ, AGRA

Taking ahead our ongoing efforts in bringing sanitation facilities to all, Parivartan has enabled sanitation facility like community bathroom, soak pit construction, drainage fitting and handpump platform renovation with water outlet in about more than 100 villages in different districts of Uttar Pradesh. Until the last quarter, it has ensured the sanitation programme has covered 214 community bathrooms construction benefitting more than 2500 community members, 1461 soak pits/ handpump renovation benefitting more than 5000 community members. Additionally, to ensure effective behavioural change, more than 400 awareness drives have been conducted in villages across the state.

MAKING WATER ACCESSIBLE | DISTRICT - PRATAPGARH, VARANASI, SHRAVASTI, GORAKHPUR, AYODHYA, PRAYAGRAJ, AGRA, MATHURA, BAHRAICH

In numerous regions of Uttar Pradesh, the critical issue of water scarcity, exacerbated by alkaline groundwater, posed a severe challenge. Traditional approaches, such as installing handpumps or attempting deep boring, proved unsuccessful due to cost constraints. In response, Parivartan collaborated with partners like PANI, ACF, SSK, S M Sehgal, and GEAG to introduce community-managed Jal Minars in the district. Overcoming initial hurdles of expenses and lack of electricity, Parivartan successfully drilled 160-200 feet deep bores and erected tanks with a capacity of 5000 litres. This initiative has led to the construction of more than 100 Jal Minars in Uttar Pradesh, significantly benefiting over 5400 families.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT | DISTRICT - LUCKNOW, UNNAO

India generates more than 2,00,000 tonnes of Municipal solid waste every day from households, commercial enterprises, educational institutions, and corporate offices. Most of this waste is mixed and hence very little of it gets recycled. Mixed waste is dumped at unauthorized landfills and often burnt, polluting the surroundings with harmful emissions. To mitigate this issue, HDFC Bank Parivartan along with SAAHAS is working in 80 villages of Uttar Pradesh by setting up sustainable infrastructure for solid waste management. The main objectives of the intervention are that the solid waste generative should be segregated at the source. It should be managed locally without any open burning and rejecting any disposal to take place in a scientific landfill. The project will focus on awareness generation and behaviour change of Gram Panchayats during the project tenure. The composting center will be renovated/ constructed as per need and the GPs will be involved in day-to-day operations so that whole process of collection, segregation and right disposal takes place in a sustainable manner.









FINANCIAL LITERACY AND INCLUSION

Financial literacy workshops conducted across various projects in Uttar Pradesh teach subjects ranging from savings to investments. They also inform rural communities on ways to access organised sources of finance.

CAPABILITY BUILDING OF MARGINAL FARMERS THROUGH FARMER FIELD SCHOOLS

LOCATION: DISTRICT SHRAVASTI

BENEFICIARY: 148 SMALLHOLDER FARMERS

THE CHALLENGE

Marginal farmers of Shravasti, one of the most flood-prone districts of Uttar Pradesh, constitute 80% of the district's farming population. These small farm holders lived in perpetual poverty as they faced the dual hardships of high input costs and low earnings. Government's efforts had failed to improve their condition and they were unaware of new farming methods, technology, and government schemes.

OUR INTERVENTION

HDFC Bank Parivartan, launched an intervention to build capability in marginal farmers of Shravasti. The intervention helped establish 8 Farmer Field Schools (FFS) to introduce the latest farming best practices, technology and skills to marginal farmers through hands-on training and practical demonstrations. Farmers visited fields of several progressive farmers, agricultural universities, government departments such as Krishi Vigyan Kendra and Horticulture Department to learn the latest farming techniques and processes.

THE RESULT

Today, small marginalised farmers of Shravasti have been empowered through facilitator farmers led training that has combined traditional farming knowledge with modern scientific knowhow to promote sustainable agriculture, natural resource management, food security, enhanced income and better livelihoods. The participatory process has improved gender equality and social cohesion in farming communities. Farmers have learnt new techniques such as jute bag farming, multilayer farming, crop residue mulching, azola farming, floriculture, organic composting and green net home nursery. They now use technologies like portable nursery raising, portable backyard gardening, solarization and time-space management to enhance their yields and incomes.

ADOPTING MODERN FARMING PRACTICES FOR FARMERS' GROWTH

LOCATION: DISTRICT GORAKHPUR

BENEFICIARY: USHA DEVI

THE CHALLENGE

Usha Devi, a farmer from Thakurpur Village no 2, is a widow with three children. She has a farm holding of 1.2 acres where she cultivated paddy and wheat using traditional farming methods. The harvest was barely able to feed her own family and there was no surplus income to support her family's financial needs. She had to turn to daily wage labour to support her family.

OUR INTERVENTION

HDFC Bank Parivartan, in association with PANI, launched an intervention under HRDP to train small farmers on modern practices such as multi-layered vegetable cropping through the trellis model. Usha Devi was provided with 30 pieces of bamboo to build a machan, GI wire, rope and high yield seeds of cucumber and bottle gourd. She was provided complete technical knowhow on the process to build a machan in the farm and all best practices related to multi-layered farming. She was also provided with a solar mobile GI unit for irrigation.

THE RESULT

Today, Usha Devi and her family successfully harvest vegetable crops in their farm using the trellis model. They were able to sell 30 quintals of cucumber, earning Rs. 60,000 for the same. Additionally, they are getting ready to sell another harvest worth Rs.65,000/-. The cost of irrigation has drastically reduced with the use of solar energy and they also have surplus income now Their overall lifestyle has improved greatly.

TREE PLANTATION **DRIVE HELD**

HDFC Bank Parivartan and The Aga Khan Foundation (India) held a tree plantation drive across 45 intervention villages in Lakhimpur, Sitapur, and Bahraich in Uttar Pradesh. 500 trees were planted in each of these villages. Saplings of Mango, Guava, Jackfruit, Neem, Gooseberry, etc; were distributed to individual farmers, while fruit-bearing trees were also planted within school premises. Additionally, a Miyawaki forest has been established in the Jataha village of Sitapur.

HANDOVER CEREMONY OF SMART SCHOOLS HELD

The handover ceremony of 30 smart schools of Varanasi, developed under HDFC Bank Parivartan's Smart School Development Project in collaboration with Ambuja Cement Foundation, was held in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. The schools feature digital class rooms, science lab, modern libraries, sports kit, water coolers, etc. to support the holistic development of students.

HDFC BANK PARTNERED WITH KHAN ACADEMY INDIA FOR IMPROVING EDUCATION

HDFC Bank Parivartan has partnered with Khan Academy India for implementing its programme on improving learning outcomes in Maths for students in JNVs, Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. The Bank's grants have helped expand and deepen the academy's work in Uttar Pradesh with the Department of Basic Education. Khan Academy India will roll out the programme in 48000 schools in Uttar Pradesh across Class 6-8.




















PARIVARTAN ON ITS PATH TO ACHIEVE GLOBAL GOALS

Rural Development
